

• [excerpts] Born -- December 8, 1878 in Virginia City, Nevada. Mother said it was a cold day with lots of snow on the ground. Left Virginia City for San Francisco in 1879, this seemingly marked the initial step in the decline of that center of mining activity.<sup>150, p 1</sup>

Entered University of California in the College of Mechanics, graduating, in May 1899 with the degree of B. S. Completed the course with an average "2" or the equivalent of the present "B" grades.<sup>150, p 2</sup>

At college was a member of Delta Kappa Epsilon, Theta Nu Epsilon and Skull & Keys; weighing 99 lbs. in my freshman year was chosen as coxswain of the Crew, they were then rowing in 4 oar barges, the only competition being with the South End Rowing Club and in inter class races. In my senior year was elected Manager of the Base Ball Team, was instrumental in hiring Joe Corbett, former pitcher of the Baltimore Orioles as our coach and for the first time winning the annual series with Stanford. At the final Stanford Game played at Recreation Park in San Francisco, the California boys stole from the Stanford Rooters a large Broad Axe which had been put on display before their crowd to emphasize the yell "Give em The Axe." This axe has since become the annual Big Game Trophy.<sup>150, p 2</sup>

May 14, 1902, I was married to Edna Josephine Donaldson, who later became the mother of Eleanor Carlisle.<sup>150, p 3</sup>

May 1912 - Employed by C. E. Grunsky, acting City Engineer of San Francisco, as Asst. engineer, working under general direction of John R. Freeman, in connection with preparation of his report on the Hetch Hetchy and other sources of supply for San Francisco. Prepared report on the Feather River and assisted on reports on the Mokelumne and Yuba Rivers.

September 1913 – Appointed Asst. Engineer under M. M. O'Shaughnessy, to take charge of construction of the Municipal Railway Extensions under a \$3,500,000 Bond issue. These extensions were designed primarily to serve the 1915 Panama Pacific Exposition in the Marina District. This work involved the construction of some 35 miles of single track with overhead and involving design and purchase of 125 cars. A detailed program and schedule was prepared covering all contracts, this was scrupulously adhered to and the railway extensions were completed and service inaugurated in time. In the early years of operation, the railway was a huge financial success and further extensions were constructed out of surplus earnings.

The work on construction of the Hetch Hetchy Project in the meantime had got underway, a number of camps had been opened on the Mountain Division, tunnel driving had gotten started in several headings. The 68 mile H. H. Railroad had been virtually completed when a suit was instituted by the railroad contractor against the City for extra work. C. R. Rankin, construction engineer on the project, who had been in charge of all the field work, was called to San Francisco to prepare the case for the City. I was thereupon, in 1919, appointed Construction Engineer to take charge of the work to relieve Rankin, while he was on the suit. With my family, I took up headquarters in Groveland, and Rankin and his family took over the house which we had been renting in San Francisco. (In December 1913, shortly after entering the City's employ I married Grace Knowlton, who on April 18, 1916, became the mother of William Nelson, and on Feb. 26, 1918, of Elizabeth Hilton, with Eleanor, this was the family that moved into Groveland, presumably for a stay of two or three months.) In this capacity, I supervised the completion of the R.R., continued the tunnel driving work, opening up several new audits, involving completion of two shafts, supervised inauguration of contract work on the construction of the O'Shaughnessy Dam, by the Utah Construction Co. About this time the City had difficulty selling the bonds for the continuation of the work. To overcome this, they conceived the idea of completing the tunnel driving in the Mountain Division, under a cost plus a fixed fee type of contract, under which the contractor undertook to arrange for the purchase of the necessary bonds. A. J. Cleary, Chief Asst. City Engineer went over with the newly formed contracting firm, the Construction Company of North America, C. C. Tinkler, president.

In 1921, following resignation of Cleary, was appointed Chief Asst. City Engineer, in charge of design and construction of all public utility work of the City Engineer's office, including the Hetch Hetchy Project. In this capacity [I] carried on the Hetch Hetchy operations, involving the Mocassin Power plant and transmission line, the 35 mile Coast Range tunnels, the San Joaquin and Bay Crossing pipe lines, the Pulgas tunnel and also in San Francisco, the Duboce tunnel for the street railway system. During this period participated in the negotiations with the P.G.&E. for the handling of the output of the Mocassin power and with the Mayor and City Attorney in Washington seeking approval of the Agreement by the U.S. Secretary of the Interior. On the H.H. work, L. T. McAfee took over as construction engineer on the tunnels, C. R. Rankin took over on the Dam, Paul Ost took over on the Street Railways and the Mocassin Power Plant.

March 1930 – Appointed General Manager and Chief Engineer of the newly created San Francisco Water Department at a salary of \$15,000 per year.<sup>150, pp 4-5,5781</sup>

O'Shaughnessy's Aid is Well Experienced in Engineer's Field

Big jobs are no novelty to Nelson A. Eckart, first assistant to City Engineer M. M. O'Shaughnessy. So he looks forward with no trepidation to assuming operative control of the Spring Valley Water Company when it is taken over by the city in March. Practically assured of the job by Mayor Rolph, Thursday, and heartily recommended by O'Shaughnessy, Eckart yesterday was hand-shook and congratulated all over the City Hall. To every congratulation he made the same response:

"It will be a big job, and no one knows that better than I do. I have no plans yet. All I know is that I will do the work as well as I know how."

### FITTED FOR JOB

Eckart is just over 50 years old, but in action and energy and quick-wittedness is one of the youngest men in the City Engineer's department. He is married and the father of three children—Eleanor, 19; William, 13, and Elizabeth, 11, and it is common report around the Eckart home at 243 Thirtieth avenue that he is their idol.

Eckart admits he is a victim of three hobbies—tennis, golf and the movies. His tennis, he tells friends confidentially, is better than his golf, but his golf isn't so bad. VIRGINIA CITY NATIVE

Born in Virginia City in 1879, Eckart was brought to San Francisco when he was a year old and has lived here since. He attended Lowell High School and was graduated from the University of California in 1899 as a mechanical and electrical engineer. After serving an apprenticeship with the Union Iron Works he was commissioned by the old Standard Electric Company to construct the Electra power plant on the Mokelumne River, east of Jackson.

Followed then a year with the Westinghouse Company at East Pittsburg, after which he returned to California to become engineer of the State Prison Board and later of the State Department of Engineering. In this position he took part in the reconstruction of San Quentin and Folsom prisons.

RETURNED TO S. F.

After a period as resident executive engineer for the Snow Water and Power Company, and resident engineer for the Oro Development Company at Belden, in the Feather River canyon, he returned to San Francisco to assist John R. Freeman on water reports for San Francisco. In the City Engineer's department in 1913 he was assigned charge of construction work of municipal street car lines, and in 1919 was appointed construction engineer in the field on the Hetch Hetchy project.

In 1921 he was appointed chief assistant to City Engineer O'Shaughnessy and has been associated with him in all construction work carried out by the department.<sup>4008</sup>

• [excerpts] A half century of farsighted leadership by a succession of mayors and engineers finally paid off on March 3, 1930, when San Francisco purchased the Spring Valley Water Company for \$39,962,606.51, creating the San Francisco Water Department under the Board of Public Works. Nelson A. Eckart, Hetch Hetchy Chief Assistant Engineer under City Engineer O'Shaughnessy, was named the first general manager and chief engineer of the newly acquired water works. This takeover of the 70-year-old private utility took place four years before Hetch Hetchy water was to reach the Pulgas Temple in San Mateo County and when the Spring Valley system had the capability of supplying 65

million gallons of water per day, under normal rainfall conditions.<sup>4924, p 14</sup>

## March 6, 1942

The hotly debated and inflammable case of the Negro motorman, Audley Cole, 21, of 2141 Bush Street, broke into the open yesterday as Nelson A. Eckart, acting manager of utilities, called for a showdown with Municipal Railway carmen. In a dramatic move to remove the stigma of race prejudice from the city's civil service system, Eckart ordered grumbling motormen to train Cole in the operation of a streetcar or face dismissal. Eckart's order came simultaneously with the disclosure that several months ago, Utilities Manager Cahill ordered a two-day suspension penalty imposed on motormen refusing to train Cole. Under authority of their union local, Division 518, AFL Carmen's Union, 10 motormen defied Cahill's order and were suspended for two days each. The men were reimbursed for their loss of wages by the union. The order, which came yesterday from Eckart, instructed William Scott, manager of the railway, to suspend for four days any motorman who refuses to instruct Cole in the operation of a streetcar. The motorman who refuses a second time will be suspended for eight days. Threats to strike rather than to train the young Negro have been reported in the ranks of the union, which several months ago voted to fine any member instructing Cole \$100.<sup>7673</sup>

Biggs was on the roof of Scofield (sp?) barracks in his boxer shorts shooting at the Japanese with a rifle (or some other equally useless weapon in light of the magnitude of the attack). Aunt Elizabeth also told me that she had been pregnant and miscarried three days after the attack. When I asked if she thought it was related to the attack she said no. Still I wonder... Her mother, Grace did not approve of her marriage and I think was also disappointed because Aunt Elizabeth rejected Christian Science which my grandmother's life and also because Aunt Elizabeth partied too much. When the war was over, Aunt Elizabeth and her husband had grown apart and she said she wasn't interested in being a housewife. She shocked her mother by getting a divorce. "No one in our family has ever" etc. Aunt Elizabeth went to either USC or UCLA and Columbia (not sure which order) and got her doctorate in psychiatric social work or what ever the proper term was then. She taught at USC or UCLA for awhile and then lived and worked in Seattle for years. She and her mother had a hard time, I think. When Aunt Elizabeth died, she told me that she would like to be buried next to her mother in the family plot at Colma, outside of San Francisco, because she said she had finally reconciled with her mom. Aunt Elizabeth played tennis, hiked, floated the Grand Canyon when she was in her seventies and was bright and funny and kept in touch with her friends throughout her life. • Colonel Biggs, a native of Seattle, WA, graduated from Queen Anne High School in 1935. He attended the University of California, Berkeley, where he was a member of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity, Skull and Keys and other honorary societies, and captain of the Freshman Track Team. In 1939, he received a bachelor's degree and an Infantry ROTC commission.

He began active duty in February of 1941, and was stationed with the 19th Infantry Regiment, 24th Infantry Division at Schofield Barracks, Oahu, at the time of the Japanese attack. He continued to serve with the regiment in Australia and through campaigns in New Guinea and the Philippines until mid-1945 in positions from platoon leader to regimental executive officer.

He held key staff positions with the US Military Government Command in Korea from 1946 to 1948, including seven months as one of two US XXIV Corps Liaison Officers representing the US with the Soviet Union Army headquarters in Pyongyang during the early development of the North Korean armed forces and the beginning of the Cold War.

In 1948, Colonel Biggs married Kitty Nettles with whom he later had three children, Richard Kirby Biggs, Deborah C. Biggs, and Timothy C. Biggs.

Colonel Biggs successfully completed the Transportation School Advanced Officers Course in 1951 and was immediately assigned to the Office of the Chief of Transportation in Washington, D.C. As a Transportation Corps officer he went on to command battalion

level units in Korea during the war and later in Germany, where he also became the V Corps Transportation Officer. He attended several Army schools, including the Army Command and General Staff College, where he also taught for four years, and graduated from the Industrial College of the Armed Forces in 1960. He commanded the 4th Terminal Command at Fort Eustis from 1963 to 1964.

Following his retirement from the military in 1966, he became the civilian assistant to the principal logistics officer in Headquarters, US Army Europe until 1972. He held the senior civilian logistics position in the Defense Attaché Office, Saigon, from 1973 to 1974, and then served on the Army General Staff. In 1976, he was appointed assistant director for materiel maintenance, Office of the Army Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics. He was later assigned as the deputy commander of the Engineer Logistics Command in Saudi Arabia, retiring from his civilian Army career in 1981.

He was awarded the Legion of Merit and Bronze Star, both with Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal and numerous civilian awards from the US Government and the Republic of Vietnam as well as a Distinguished Member of the Transportation Corps Regiment. He also worked for a defense contractor operating the US base maintenance contract in Turkey, and as a consultant with a number of other base maintenance contractors.

During 1993 and 1994 he volunteered at Fort Eustis as a co-author of the book <u>Spearhead</u> of <u>Logistics</u> : <u>A History of the United States Army Transportation Corps</u>, the definitive history of US Army transportation from the Colonial period to the present and required reading for all Transportation officer students.

Colonel Biggs served as the executive vice president of the board of directors of the Army Transportation Museum Foundation, and belonged to several professional military associations. He was a volunteer in the Elderhostel programs at the College of William and Mary and also a very active member of the James City County community.<sup>5871</sup>

• Dave, I don't have any information or knowledge personally about "Dick" Biggs. I think that I may be able to find something in Aunt Elizabeth's papers which are stored in my basement. Aunt Elizabeth told me very little and they were divorced before I was in the picture. However, it seems to me that at one time I found an obituary notice among her things and that might help us if I can find it again. I just don't know anything about him. Martha<sup>5872</sup>

• My dad was at Pearl Harbor. They felt after the war (according to him) that they married too young and were somewhat strangers so decided to divorce. Actually he was 'excommunicated' for communion from the Catholic church for divorcing. How funny to

come across this relationship.<sup>6461</sup>

• just a little more about Pearl Harbor. My dad was shaving when the bombing started and had only shaved half his face. He and a LT. ran to the armory to get weapons as they didn't have anything issued out. The MP there refused to let them in. They knocked him down, broke open the armory and began issuing rifles and weapons. He then did as you heard, climbed on the roof and started firing. Once the wave was over they hurriedly got dressed and took a company and climbed up into the Mt to fight off the Japs where they were in the field around 7 days. When he came back down, he had a growth of beard on one side, but much less on the other. He went into the day room and the soldiers there who keep daily records had transcribed them and thrown away the copy. He took it and has had it for many years. Before he died, he and my Mom went back to Hawaii and gave the original to the Arizona museum.

He was indeed a strong drinker back in those days, but loads of fun and a grad of UC Berkley. I am sure I have pics of Elizabeth (if my mom didn't get rid of them...) but his college yearbook for sure may have some pics of her.

Apparently neither family approved of the marriage, and I'm sure my Dad was too wild in those days.

He did, of course settle down and really was a wonderful father, husband and family man. I didn't know she had miscarried, so that is news to me.

We can talk more if you want, but this is a confirmed marriage. Debbie<sup>6461</sup>

• My Dad stayed in the military 30 years, then civil service for 15, then private sector military work. They were stationed first in San Fran where my older brother Kirby (Richard K.) was born in May 1949.

The next year they came back to Williamsburg (Ft. Eustis) area where I was born in Sept 1950. (Dad was all transportation and logistics as you can see that the transportation library was named in his honor posthumously and he co-wrote the 'spearhead of logistics' which is used today for officers in the Trans. corp. after he retired)

Dad then went into the Korean war and Mom and Kirby and I went to live in Fla. near her relatives while he was gone.

When he came back, he was stationed and taught at the industrial college in Ft. Leavenworth where Timmy, my younger brother was born in Dec 1956.

We stayed there for about 4 more years, then back to Washington DC for a year. In 1963, we headed overseas to Germany for 3 years, then back to Ft. Eustis. Once again in 1968 back to Heidelberg, Germany for 5 years.

From there it is a litany of the places they lived. He served as head of civilians 2 years in Saigon, VN during the fall of that city, and in Turkey twice for two year stints both after he retired and in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia for a private contractor.

He and Mom eventually retired to Williamsburg, Va where they live for about 7 years before he got renal cancer and eventually died from that.<sup>6464</sup>

# • Steam in the Chronicle Office.

Today the [Vallejo] DAILY CHRONICLE is printed by steam. We judged it to be an important event in the history of Vallejo enterprise when less than two years ago the proprietor of this establishment introduced a poser press to accommodate the rapidly increasing circulation of the CHRONICLE, but since that time his business has been increased so wonderfully, that he will now have four presses driven by steam. In fact, steam, or some other motor other than human muscle, had become a necessity to accommodate the business of the CHRONICLE office, and he feels a natural pride in being the first party to introduce it into a Vallejo printing office. Our engine is a neat and compact six-horse power, built at the Union Iron Works, San Francisco, from drawings made by W. R. Eckart, and is in every respect a complete piece of machinery. The shafting and hangings are from the Foundry and Machine Works of Heald & McCormick, Vallejo, who have made an admirable job. Hereafter we shall be able to expedite the issue of the CHRONICLE, and accommodate patrons with the delivery of job work at an earlier time than formerly. The machinery may be seen at work after three o'clock in the afternoon.<sup>1999</sup>

• SERENADE. The National Brass band serenaded Mr. Eckart and his bride last evening, thus welcoming them home from their bridal tour. Mr. Eckart responded handsomely, taking the boys to the Dawson House, where they indulged in champagne and other good things.<sup>2000</sup>

• A NARROW ESCAPE. — The Oroville Record, of the 17th instant, says on Friday night of last week, Mr. W. R. Eckart, of the Marysville Foundry, had a narrow escape from assassination in Oroville. It seems that a company of Chinamen in the Lava Beds, had purchased some machinery from the Marysville Foundry, and by some means, had got the

idea into their Celestial heads that they were being cheated by the interpreter who had made the purchase for them, and Mr. Eckart came to Oroville to settle the matter. The Chinamen seemed to think that he was in with the interpreter, and bad feeling was engendered against them. At night as he was standing on the corner of Montgomery and Huntoon streets, a Chinaman passed and struck him with a knife. The blow was aimed at his heart, and given with much force. Fortunately it struck a large and thick memorandum book in the breast pocket of his coat, which proved sufficient to check the progress of the knife. Such was the force of the blow, however, that the point of the knife penetrated the cover of the book, passed through several letters enclosed in the book and penetrated several leaves. The Chinaman escaped in the darkness. It is understood that the interpreter knows the perpetrator of the dastardly attempt to assassinate Mr. Eckart, but does not know of his personal whereabouts.

• Statement of Services as a Mechanical Engineer

Was born in Chillicothe, Ohio June 17th, 1841; graduated from St. Clair Street Academy, Cleveland, Ohio, as a Civil Engineer. Served a regular apprenticeship with Griffith, Ebert & Wedge, Zanesville, Ohio, as a machinist, and afterwards worked as a journeyman and draughtsman in their establishment.

At the breaking out of the war, entered the Navy as Engineer, July 8th, 1861, serving in that capacity on various government vessels until 1864, when my resignation was tendered and accepted, then entered the employment of H. J. Booth & Co., proprietors of the Union Iron Works, San Francisco, Cal. as assistant draughtsman, serving them afterwards as their Chief Draughtsman, Foreman, and Superintendent.

In May 1867 was duly examined as to my qualifications and licensed to act as a 1st class Chief Engineer in the Merchant Service (license No. 25, 1867). Same has been renewed on application in 1871 and 1875. After leaving the Union Iron Works in 1869, entered the employ of the U. S. Government at Mare Island, Cal. as Foreman, and was soon afterward appointed Superintendent of Steam Machinery where I remained until leaving to enter as partner in the Marysville Foundry January 8th, 1872 with my former employer. Where we are now carrying on the business of manufacturing mining and marine machinery under the firm name of Booth and Eckart.

Was educated as a Civil Engineer, at the St. Clair Street academy in Cleveland, Ohio was admitted as an Associate to the Institute of Naval Architects in 1869.

The boat as well as the machinery will be built from the designs and specifications of Mr. Eckart, Superintendent of the Fulton Foundry of this city, also the construction engineer and designer of the "Meteor" which has given such satisfaction to the company.<sup>2583</sup>

# AN UNPLEASANT EXPERIENCE

A Traveler Having to Wait for a Bed Until a Corpse was Removed From It.

W. R. Eckart, of San Francisco, is still in town. He had a somewhat unpleasant experience at Pocatello, at which place he had to stop over one night on his way here. After some delay he was shown to a room at the railway hotel, and although the thermometer

registered a long way below zero, he found the windows wide open and the room looking anything but cheerful. After having the windows closed and the lamp lighted, he remarked that there was a large number of medicine bottles in the room; and after getting into bed he became painfully aware of the fact that the air was strongly impregnated with the fumes of carbolic acid. The night being extremely cold, he drew the bedclothes over his head, when he found the carbolic was stronger in bed than anywhere else. Visions of small pox at once floated through his brain, and he came to the conclusion that some one from California with that disease had occupied the bed; but knowing that if such was the case the danger was already done, and he would gain nothing by leaving bed, he lay quiet and went to sleep. In the morning he asked Boniface for an explanation, and was informed that a railroad man who had had his legs crushed had been occupying the room. Mr. Eckart said he hoped the gentleman had not been disturbed on his account. "Oh, no" said my host, "he died at 5 o'clock yesterday evening, and his body was sent east." This, of course, accounted for the delay in giving him the room.

# SUBMARINE BOAT. She makes a remarkable showing.

Considered to be Absolutely Safe — The Vessel Dives Beneath the Water.

GREEN POINT, (N. Y.), Sept. 22. — The submarine torpedo-boat Holland made a remarkable good showing on her practice run today, and aside from the regular run of a mile under water at a uniform depth of seven feet, discharged a regulation Whitehead torpedo such as is used in the Navy. The trial lasted one hour and a half. W. R. Eckhart, [sic] consulting engineer of the Union Iron Works, San Francisco, took the plunge in the Holland. The torpedo, when discharged, took a downward course and struck the bottom fifty feet from the bow. The cause of the deflection of the torpedo off its course was thought to be the disarrangement of the mechanism. Otherwise the trial was most successful. Afterward the Holland, with Mr. Eckhart aboard, made a deep dive, completely submerging the flags, which are ten feet high. Five minutes later she came to the surface.

Eckhart said he considered the boat absolutely safe and practical, and would prefer being aboard the Holland when submerged than in the fireroom of any surface torpedo boat. Source: Newspaper clipping. Source and date unknown.<sup>8</sup>

• "W. R. Eckart, veteran construction and mechanical engineer, A. M. Hunt and W. F. C. Hasson, electrical engineers, served as consultants during the building of the plant. L. M.

Hancock was the engineer in charge." Nevada County Power Co. "Work on the Nevada power plant started with a rush July 5, 1895." "Despite the obstacles, the Nevada power plant was finished in seven months. Power flowed into Nevada City in Feb. 1896; to Grass Valley, a month later. Initial installed capacity was 300 kilowatts, soon to raised to 1,200 kW." (pp. 128-135)

Eckart was "In charge of design and construction of mechanical and hydraulic equipment" of Electra Powerhouse built by Prince André Poniatowski and his Standard Elec. Co. of California (inc. Nov. 27, 1897, W. Vir; reincorporated in Calif. Feb. 7, 1899). Poniatowski (first under Calif. Exploration Co, inc. April 1896 succeeded by California Exploration, Ltd, inc. 1898) optioned several mining properties in Amador County and needed electricity to develop and operate the mines. Local supplier was Blue Lakes Water Co. (org. 1887 by W. Frank Pierce to build "a pipeline from Amador Co. to Oakland to supply 17,500,000 gal of water daily"). He negotiated with Pierce to supply electricity and financed (\$122,500) the construction of the Blue Lakes Powerhouse (450 kilowatt generators) "on an old millsite on the Mokelumne River 5 miles from Jackson, where water could be dropped 1,040 feet from the Amador Canal..." The plant began operating October 25, 1897. After this project Poniatowski conceived of a larger power plant which would be able to serve San Francisco, 143 miles away. He visited the Blue Lakes Region to examine the potential water resources including engineering data, water storage capacity, size of dams, and estimated costs. He estimated that the power plant would have to generate as much as 15,000 kwatts. This project was too big for his company so, working with W. H. Crocker, developed a plan of financing which included the formation of the Standard Electric Co. of Calif. The Blue Lakes Powerhouse was operated successfully until Nov. 1, 1899, when fire destroyed construction of the Electra Plant "the last word in design and construction." Chief Engineer, "Dr. Frederick A. C. Perrine, first professor of electrical engineering at Stanford Univ. and later pres. of the Stanley Elec. Mfg. Co." was responsible for the design of the electrical parts of the project and for the transmission system. "Associated with him were Frank G. Baum, brilliant Stanford engineer, and A. C. Bunker, young electrical engineer who had had experience with the Stanley Electrical Co., manufacturers of Electra's generating equipment. Engineers C. P. Gilbert and C. H. Ellison were members of the extensive staff." "In charge of design and construction of mechanical and hydraulic equipment was veteran W. R. Eckart who had a broad background of experience in mining and hydraulic work. He was an engineering officer of the Navy in the Civil War. He had designed the first locomotive built in Calif. by Peter Donahue's Union Iron Works. He designed and built for the Bliss family the steamer Meteor which was operated for years on Lake Tahoe. At Virginia City he had been Consulting engineer for Mackay, Flood, O'Brien

and Fair in the Comstock mines, installing high-pressure pipe lines to lift water from the lower workings to the surface by huge Cornish pumps."<sup>2532,3945, p 167</sup>

• "Deep Mining Work In The Comstock Lode," by W. R. Eckart, M. E.

Prince Poniatowski, wired me last night, that you were coming with him to New York, and would be at the Waldorf on Monday. I am sorry I will not be here when you arrive, as I should have liked to talk with you on several topics. I am going to Idaho, with another party, where we have been prospecting mines for some time, and will probably arrive in San Francisco in about two weeks.<sup>5750</sup>

• When the history of engineering on the Pacific coast comes to be written it will not be complete unless the work of W. R. Eckart occupies the large place in the book that it occupies in fact and in the experience of his contemporaries. Mr. Eckart has been honored by membership in the following societies: American Society of Civil Engineers since 1881; American Society of Mechanical Engineers since 1882 -- vice president from 1883 to 1885; The Institution of Mechanical Engineers, London, 1878; Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers, 1893; American Society of Naval Engineers; Associate Member of The Institution of Naval Architects, London.<sup>189, p 157</sup>

• [excerpt] Eckart was always on the firing line of progress and delighted in nothing more than in dealing with new and difficult problems. He was eminently a student in his manner of handling them, and spared no pains in insuring a sound foundation for his proposed solution or mode of treatment. He was notable as a collector of books and professional literature and of fine precision apparatus used in engineering measurements; was a member of many engineering societies and technical organizations, and occasionally contributed papers of value to their transactions. In 1872 he married Harriet

Louise Gorham; to them were born three sons and one daughter. After a long period of failing health, during which he retained his keen interest in engineering, he died in Palo Alto, Cal., at the home of his eldest son.<sup>1998</sup>

• <u>William Eckart Dies at Ripe Old Age, Was Former Resident of Marysville and Had Wide</u> <u>Reputation As An Engineer</u>

William R. Eckart, a brother of George R. Eckart of this city, died at Palo Alto Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock. He had been ill for some time and heart trouble was his ailment.

Deceased made his home in San Francisco until about a year ago, when he moved to Palo Alto. He was a former resident of Marysville and in the seventies was the proprietor of the Marysville foundry. Leaving Marysville he was form many years mechanical engineer for the Union Iron Works, and designed the engines of the famous old battleship, Oregon, and other ships built by this concern. After he retired from this position he entered the employ of the United States Government and was the representative of the government on all types of government boats. For the past number of years he was the consulting engineer for a number of large electrical and other corporations and had a national reputation as an electrical and mechanical engineer.

His wife, who survives him, was Miss Hattie Gorham, a former Marysville girl, and the daughter of the late Charles M. Gorham, who was for a number of years the mayor of this city. Deceased at the time of his death was coiner in the United States Mint at San Francisco.

Deceased will be buried today at Palo Alto. He was seventy-three years old.<sup>212</sup>

Military: • During his days of apprenticeship Mr. Eckart made numerous trips at the trial of new river boat engines and this awakened in him a desire to enter the government service as a naval engineer. At the outbreak of the Civil war he successfully passed the examination before the board of engineers, winning highest rank at that date. He was appointed third assistant engineer July 30, 1861, and ordered at once to join the fleet of naval vessels on the Pacific coast. While thus serving in the San Francisco harbor he met, and won the friendship of, a number of California's most eminent men in the engineering profession. Mr. Eckart had been mustered into the United States naval service as third assistant engineer on the Narragansett which was commanded by Commander S. E. Woodworth and was attached to the Pacific squadron under Commodore Charles H. Bell. On the 3d of December, 1862, he was transferred to the Lancaster under command of Commodore Joseph Lannan, of the Pacific squadron, and on the 23d of November, 1863,

was returned to the Narragansett. The Narragansett and the Lancaster cruised up and down the Pacific waters along the coast of the United States, Mexico, the Central American states and South America, visiting the ports of San Francisco, Panama, New Grenada and Callao, doing patrol duty and protecting the interests of this country during the Civil war.

III health at length forced Mr. Eckart to resign and he was honorably discharged at San Francisco, March 2, 1864.<sup>189, pp 153-4</sup>

# **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

## W. R. ECKART

The Company's Consulting Engineer, a Veteran Foremost in His Profession on the Pacific Coast

Ohio has produced more presidents than any other state. There may be something in the environment or something in the consciousness of the great achievements of her famous sons that impels a goodly percentage of Ohio-born men to advance to positions of prominence. The incentive of close example, the germ of ambition, whatever it be, the Ohio man at his best climbs above the average that start under like circumstances. Who today are the half dozen great engineers on the Pacific slope? You can't name them and omit W. R. Eckart from the front rank. For more than forty years his life has been identified intimately and exclusively with most of the great engineering problems and developments of this part of the world.

He began life as an Ohioan sixty-eight years ago, for he was born at Chillicothe June 17th, 1841. His mother's people had been pioneers in the settlement of that part of Ohio. His father was a merchant, with shipping interests in vessels on the great lakes.

First young Eckart attended private schools. Then his mother died when he was 12. After some public schooling in Chillicothe and Cleveland he took a special mathematical course in an academy at Cleveland in the hope of becoming a civil engineer, as he had a relative who was a civil engineer and president of the Marietta and Cincinnati Railroad, which was being somebody in those days! When the boy was in his early teens the father moved to Zanesville, where he had a managing interest in a flour mill. Now it happened that the power for this grist mill came from six water wheels. New wheels had to be installed. Young Eckart was assisting the millwright. And as he worked at setting up those wheels he was noticed. A member of a firm prominent in those days in general mill and steamboat work offered him a place as apprentice. The youth had voyaged a little on Ohio and Mississippi river steamboats, and marine engineering had fascinated him. So he accepted the apprenticeship. The firm's junior partner was manager of the works; he was master mechanic of great ability, and had been apprentice and foreman to Sir Joseph

Whitworth in England, when the Whitworth works grew famous for machine tool construction. The manager became young Eckart's friend, his severest and most encouraging critic. No work was done "good enough"; it had to be finished as the best possible. That apprenticeship and those ideas laid the foundation of the Eckart thoroughness and efficiency as a practical engineer.

Participation in steamboat trial trips to test machinery further interested the apprentice in marine engineering. July 2d, 1861, he took the government examinations and passed them with the rank of No. 1 of his date. He was appointed a third assistant engineer and ordered to join the United States naval fleet at San Francisco.

During his three years of naval duty, from the time he was 20 till he was 23, he made the acquaintance in San Francisco and gained the lasting friendship of the foremost men then in the engineering profession in California — Paul Torqua, Joseph Moore, Irving M. Scott, Wallace Hanscom, Huttner, Specht. Because of poor health he resigned from the navy and decided to make his home in San Francisco. He secured employment in 1864 in the drafting room of H. J. Booth & Co., a concern that manufactured mining machinery and repaired coast steamships. Irving M. Scott was the company's chief draftsman at that time. A year later Eckart, then 24, was chief draftsman, and August 30th, 1865, the Booth & Co. shops turned out from Eckart's designs and drawings the first locomotive manufactured in California. The trial run was made that day on the railroad from San Francisco to San Jose, with the governor, state and city officials, and other notables as invited passengers.

In 1867 Eckart went east, passed the examinations that licensed him to be a first-class chief engineer in the merchant marine, and then returned to California and continued his work with Booth & Co. In February of 1869, after nearly five years with the concern designing mills and mining machinery, he resigned to accept the appointment as draftsman to the steam engineering department at the Mare Island Navy Yard. That was when he was 27. He became foreman machinist, and was finally promoted to superintendent of steam machinery at the navy yard. He designed steam machinery, propellers, and dynamometers for the noted experiments made by the government with "steam launch No. 4."

When he was 30 he left the navy yard to become a partner in the Marysville foundry firm of Prescott, Scheidel & Co., later styled Booth & Eckart. The firm built a great variety of hydraulic and mining machinery. Because of his experience in the experiments with the government launch Eckart guaranteed a speed of 21 miles an hour when taking the contract to build the little steamer Meteor for the Carson Lumber Company's use on Lake Tahoe, and the Meteor made the speed and was at the time the fastest boat of its size in

the world.

At 31 Eckart was appointed consulting engineer in the sinking of the four air shafts for the famous Sutro tunnel in Nevada. He spent months experimenting at Virginia City, collecting in his minute and methodical way data necessary to a commanding understanding of the whole situation. It was nasty, suffocating work, deep down in the mines, in a steamy, reeking atmosphere, where drops of subterranean water blistered the skin.

He had already designed the hoisting and drainage works for the Belcher, Yellow Jacket, Ophir, C. & C., and other historic mines.

In 1873 he established his residence in Virginia City as the consulting engineer for that remarkable quartette of bonanza kings, Mackay, Flood, O'Brien, and Fair.

About 1876 it became evident to the big operators on the Comstock Lode that heavy and powerful pumping and hoisting machinery would have to be installed to operate at a depth of 2,000 or 3,000 feet below the 1,600-foot level to be tapped by the Sutro drainage tunnel, which was then in 15,500 feet and had about 5,000 feet still to go to reach the lode. Prescott, Scott & Co. and the Risdon Iron Works were keen competitors for the contracts to construct the desired machinery. The firm that could produce an acceptable design first usually got the job. So Prescott, Scott & Co. sent Eckart down to San Francisco to help Irving M. Scott with the designs. And there was where Eckart's earlier collection of minute data counted. While he did not design the great hydraulic pumps of the Comstock, his experiments in 1880 and 1881, while a member of the United States Geological Survey preparing his government report on the "Mechanical Appliances of the Comstock Lode," became classics for the information of engineers, as the problems involved things not before undertaken in engineering and difficulties of a peculiar nature because of the great depth and the subterranean hot waters encountered.

About 1880, when deep mining on the Comstock began to decline, Eckart, then 39, moved to San Francisco and opened an office as a consulting engineer, and for ten years designed or supervised the construction of works for many well-known mines in California, Utah, and old Mexico. He made the plans for the Anaconda Copper Works in Montana and the hoisting and reduction works for Haggin and Tevis. In 1896 he solved the problem of getting the water out of the Alliston Ranch Mine at Grass Valley, which had lain idle and its lower levels bafflingly submerged for thirty years.

When the Union Iron Works entered upon its great career of warship building Eckart was engaged as its consulting engineer, and as such he assisted in conducting most of the preliminary and official trial trips and in rendering the reports.

In 1899 he was appointed consulting engineer for the Standard Electric Company, now

owned by the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, and then became it resident constructing engineer for all its hydraulic works, reservoirs, pipe lines, ditches, and power houses. Those were the days of pioneering in long-distance transmission of electric energy, and Eckart, who, more than a generation earlier, had taken so prominent a part in the work on the Comstock of getting the boiling water out of the depths of the Sierra Nevada mountains, was among the first to solve the problem of getting the melting snows from the tops of those same mountains down to hydroelectric plants that would transmit the energy on 200 miles to the local needs of the coast cities. Since 1907 he has been consulting engineer for the Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

His life has been busy but unobtrusive, his achievements in his profession many, and his recognition partly expressed by membership accorded him in the most prominent engineering societies of American and England.<sup>244</sup>

# • WILLIAM ROBERTS ECKART, M. Am. Soc. C. E. DIED DECEMBER 8TH, 1914.

William Roberts Eckart was born on June 17th, 1841, at Chillicothe, Ohio. His father, William R. Eckart, was a merchant of prominence, who, at one time, had large shipping interests on the Lakes and, later, a managing interest in the Putnam Flour Mills, at Zanesville, Ohio. His mother was member of the Carlisle family, pioneers in the settlement of Ohio.

After attending the public schools of Chillicothe and Cleveland, Mr. Eckart, having determined to take up the Profession of Civil Engineering, took a special course in mathematics at the St. Clair Street Academy, in Cleveland. Accepting the opportunity of serving an apprenticeship in the works of Griffith, Ebert, and Wedge, a firm of good reputation for general mill and steamboat work, he had the good fortune to come under the observation and to obtain the friendly interest of the junior partner, Mr. Wedge, who had had exceptional opportunities, in the shops of Sir Joseph Whitworth, in the manufacture of machine tools requiring extreme accuracy of construction. The effect of Mr. Wedge's insistence that "the best" was to be attained, was not lost on Mr. Eckart, but supplemented his natural ability and became apparent in all his work.

It was natural that his early opportunity to work on steamboat construction and to participate in trial trips, awoke in Mr. Eckart a desire to enter the Government service as a Naval Engineer. The application was made, and in the examinations of June, 1861, he received the highest rating of all applicants of that date.

On July 30th, 1861, he was appointed Third Assistant Engineer and ordered to join the fleet of naval vessels on the Pacific Coast. He arrived in San Francisco in the latter part of

1861, and soon became well known among, and formed friendships with, California's foremost engineers, including Paul Torqua, Joseph Moore, Irving M. Scott, Wallace Hanscom, Huttner, Specht, and many others.

In 1864, after resigning from the Navy on account of ill health, Mr. Eckart entered the em-ploy of H. J. Booth and Company, at San Francisco, under Mr. Irving M. Scott who was Chief Draftsman, and was engaged principally on the design of mining machinery and steamboat work. As Chief Draftsman with the same firm, Mr. Eckart designed the first locomotive built in California, which was given its trial trip from San Francisco to San José on August 30th, 1865.

In 1869, Mr. Eckart, then holding a license as First-Class Chief Engineer in the Merchant Service, accepted appointment as Draftsman in the Steam Engineering Department of the Mare Island Navy Yard, where, later, he was Foreman Machinist and Superintendent of Steam Machinery. A report by Mr. B. F. Isherwood and Mr. Eckart to the Secretary of the Navy on the relative efficiency of different propellers, and dynamometers used in making the necessary experiments. ["On Marine Propulsion," Transactions, Inst. of Naval Architects of London, 1872, Vol. XIII, p. 315.]

In 1871, Mr. Eckart left the Navy Yard, and entered into partnership with Prescott, Scheidel and Company, at Marysville, the firm name being afterward changed to Booth and Eckart. This firm specialized in hydraulic, milling, and mining machinery, and by reason of its favorable location did a prosperous business.

In 1876, the firm of Prescott, Scott, and Company, which succeeded that of H. J. Booth and Company, took some large contracts for pumping machinery for the Comstock Mines, and Mr. Eckart was recalled to San Francisco to assist in its design and to superintend its construction. By this time quite a rivalry had sprung up between Prescott, Scott, and Company (The Union Iron Works), and the Risdon Iron Works, in producing designs of machinery to handle the water and ores at Virginia City.

At this date the Sutro Tunnel was "in" 15,500 ft., had 5,000 ft. more to go, and would strike the Comstock Lode just below the 1,600-ft. level. The mine owners were already realizing that nothing but the heaviest and best designed machinery would meet the requirements on all the workings below the tunnel and, therefore, designs for pumps and hoists of large capacity to reach 4,000 ft. below the surface were decided on and called for. Not only the great depth, but also the ventilation and sinking of shafts in virgin ground abounding in large but unknown quantities of hot water to be met and overcome, presented problems unparalleled in engineering experience in any part of the world, and Mr. Eckart had a large share in dealing with and overcoming these conditions.

Having acted as Consulting Engineer for Sutro in sinking four shafts on the line of the

tunnel, the investigations then made helped him materially when, in 1876, the orders came for the large pumps and hoists. He spent months in Virginia City experimenting, taking "cards" from pumps where the water would "boil an egg" and the vapors "airbound the pumps", and where the expansion and contraction strains due to great changes in temperature often wrecked the heaviest castings. The knowledge thus gained was of great advantage to the firm he represented.

About this time, Mr. Eckart moved to Virginia City and became Consulting Engineer to the "Bonanza Firm," consisting of Messrs. J. W. Mackay, I. C. Flood, J. J. O'Brien, and James G. Fair, which owned or controlled nearly all the "North End" mines. During this time, he was Manager of the Fulton Foundry, at Virginia City. In 1878, he was also appointed United States Deputy Mineral Surveyor for the State of Nevada. During the following two years, a great part of his time was occupied in the underground workings of the Virginia City and Gold Hill Mines, investigating, planning, repairing, and improving the pumps and machinery, as the mines grew deeper and the water kept increasing. While still a resident of Virginia City, he, in connection with Mr. W. I. Salkeld, a noted millwright of the time, designed and built the Bulwer Standard Mill, at Bodie, which, at that time, was one of largest pan mills for working ore.

During the early part of 1880, Mr. Eckart was appointed a member of the U.S. Geological Survey under Mr. Clarence King, and was given charge of investigating and reporting on "The Mechanical Appliances of the Comstock Lode." On this work, which was practically a labor of love, he spent nearly two years collecting data, testing pumps, engines, and hoists, and making drawings for the Government of all the machinery on the Comstock. The finest instruments procurable in the United States and Europe were used in the various investigations of efficiency. Hydraulic indicators tested and calibrated for from 500 to 5,500 lb. per sq. in. were used in testing the hydraulic pumps designed for the Cholar, Norcross, and Savage Shafts. Chronographs, to measure and record the velocities of engines and pump rods, accurate to 1/500 sec., were used on the surface and at a depth of 2,500 ft. The use of this instrument enabled results to be obtained which became of great value; diagrams taken from the heavy rods and pumps on the lower levels gave the clue to the location of the strains which had been so destructive in breaking rods and balance bobs in the past. The velocity curves of the rods and pumps revealed the fact, not theretofore known, and only in recent years properly understood, that the elasticity of long rods could give rise to free vibrations which at times were superposed on the force vibration and accelerations due to the engines and pumps, so that maximum vibrations and strains resulted at certain parts of the rods, which exceeded the elastic limit of the timber of which the rods were constructed. Changes were thus determined in the location

of balance bobs and weights, which increased the efficiency of the pumps and checked the destruction of the rods and bobs. Some of these velocity diagrams, as well as illustrations of the largest pump engines and the hydraulic pumps, were published by Professor A. Riedler, of Berlin, while acting as Commissioner of Mines to the German Government in 1893.

In 1881, Mr. Eckart removed to San Francisco and opened offices there as a Consulting and Constructing Engineer and, during the following eight or ten years, some of the largest and most important mining plants were designed and constructed under his supervision. The pumping engine for the Ontario Mine, with perhaps the largest Cornish pump for deep mining ever built in the United States, was constructed from his designs during this period. The pumps were 20 in. in diameter, with 10-ft. stroke; two pumps at each station operated from one pump rod, 2,000 ft. long. In 1881, he began, for Haggin and Tevis, plans for all the Anaconda Copper Works, Hoists and Reduction Works, in Montana, which were started as a silver mill with a capacity of less than 350 tons per day, were increased in size and changed by addition until, in 1888, they were capable of working 3,000 tons per day. He designed and carried out much other work for the same firm.

In 1883, the Union Iron Works was changed to an incorporated company, and Mr. Eckart was retained as Consulting Engineer in matters pertaining to the propelling power of the Government vessels built by that Company. He was present at and assisted in conducting nearly all the preliminary and Government trials of these vessels.

In 1899, Mr. Eckart was appointed Consulting Engineer to the Standard Electric Company, and afterward became Engineer in charge of construction as well. He continued to act as Consulting Engineer after the completion of the plant, and after the Pacific Gas and Electric Company acquired his property as a part of its great power system, he was retained in the same capacity by the latter company, in connection with the hydroelectric branch of the work.

In 1907, the Snow Mountain Water and Power Company engaged Mr. Eckart as Consulting and Constructing Engineer, and he was connected with that company until he retired from active business at the close of 1913. He continued in the employ of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company, however, to the day of his death, which occurred on December 8th, 1914, at the residence of his son, Mr. W. R. Eckart, Jr., in Palo Alto, Cal. He is survived by his widow, Harriet Louise Eckart, and four children, W. R. Eckart, Jr., of the Leland Stanford, Jr., University, Charles F. Eckart, Olaa, Hawaii, Nelson A. Eckart, M. Am. Soc. C. E., of San Francisco, and Mrs. C. E. Hume, of Piedmont, Cal.

Mr. Eckart had unusual talent as an experimenter and investigator. His methods were thor-ough, painstaking, and accurate, and his records of tests and experiments could

always be regarded as absolutely trustworthy. Most of the special instruments and devices needed in his various investigations were designed and made by himself. Among such instruments was a "Chronograph for Engineering Purposes, with the Hipp Escapement", described under that title by him in a paper [Transactions, Am. Soc. Mech. Engrs., Vol. 3, p. 184] presented before the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, in 1882. In the discussion of that paper, the late Robert H. Thurston, M. Am. Soc. C. E., of Cornell University, speaks of Mr. Eckart as follows: "He is a very careful worker. In fact, I have not met in the profession a man who seemed better adapted to the application of fine measurements to experimentation on the steam engine." This instrument was devised for use in the investigations made by Mr. Eckart on the Cornish pumps of the Comstock Lode, and was used subsequently in other investigations requiring accurate time measurements.

As a man and among his colleagues, Mr. Eckart had the admiration of all who knew him. He was a hard worker, always going to the bottom of his problems; and the mass of data which he had accumulated and the results of his ripe experience, were at the service of this colleagues whenever he was appealed to. His friendly help has been appreciated and will be remembered by all who have worked or conferred with him.

Mr. Eckart was honored by membership in the following Engineering Societies: American Society of Mechanical Engineers, April, 1882; Institution of Mechanical Engineers, London, January, 1878; Society of Naval Architects and Marine Engineers, May, 1893; American Society of Naval Engineers; and Associate Member of the Institute of Naval Architects, London.

Mr. Eckart was elected a Member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, on January 5th, 1881.<sup>245</sup>

# • William Roberts Eckart

[excerpt] One need but to see William Roberts Eckart to know that he is a man of forceful character whose habit it is to accomplish what he undertakes and the records show that he has risen to a position of distinction among representative American mechanics and engineers. He was born in Chillicothe, Ohio, June 17, 1841, a son of William Roberts and Eleanor (Carlisle) Eckart. In the maternal line he represents one of the pioneer families of that portion of the state. In 1842 his parents removed to Cleveland, where the father, who was a merchant, had large shipping interests in vessels on the lakes.

William Roberts Eckart, Jr., began his education in a private school of Cleveland but after his mother's death, which occurred when he was but twelve years of age, his time was divided between the public schools of that city and of Chillicothe until he entered upon a special course in mathematics at the St. Clair Street Academy of Cleveland for the purpose

of preparing for the profession of civil engineering. In the '50s the family home was established in Zanesville, Ohio, where the father had a managing interest in the Putnam flour mills.<sup>189, p 153</sup>

# • Gorham Quits Federal Mint

Ill Health Causes Ex-Marysvillian To Resign

Marysville (Yuba Co.), July 22 — Charles M. Gorham, at one time a leading business man of this city, which he also served as Mayor, yesterday stepped down and out as smelter and refiner at the San Francisco Mint, having resigned because of ill health after two decades of splendid service. He will hold on until his successor, E. R. Leach, at present cashier of the Mint, can qualify.

Gorham has been wanting to quit for some time, but owing to an extra rush of work and his long experience, was urged to remain. His health has not been good, and a year ago he was injured in a street car accident, since which time he has been anxious to rest. His responsibility was very great and he desired to lay down the burden.

When he resided in this city, Gorham was one of the most prominent and popular residents. He still has many warm friends and numerous acquaintances here who will regret to hear of his resignation and ill health.

His brother, George Gorham, was the Republican candidate for Governor of California at one time.<sup>3875</sup>

# • Former Resident Died In Berkeley This Week

After a long life of usefulness, Charles M. Gorham, a former prominent resident of Marysville, died at his Berkeley home this week, following a short illness of which acquaintances in this city were not aware. Mr. Gorham, who was 81 years of age at the time of his demise, during his life was prominently identified with the political history of

Marysville. Being one of the early residents he was elected city clerk of Marysville in 1858, three years after his arrival, and was re-elected to the same office in 1860, serving with satisfaction until 1863. During the two terms in this office he became popular with the voters and in 1868 he was the choice of Marysville people for the office of mayor. Five years he served in this important capacity, in 1878 Charles Gorham was selected as police judge which office he held for a term of one year, retiring from public life at the end of this period to devote his time to business.

About fifteen years ago the deceased removed from Marysville to San Francisco, where he became an official at the United States mint. Later with his family he took up his residence in Berkeley where he remained until death occurred.

Surviving the dead man besides his widow, are the following; three daughters, Mrs. W. R. Eckart of San Francisco, Mrs. Morgan of Berkeley and Mrs. Ormsby of Tucson, Ariz. Mrs. Eckart is a sister-in-law of Geo. Eckart of this city.

Deceased was also a brother of the late Senator George C. Gorham, who was at one time a candidate for governor of the state of California.<sup>210</sup>

They therefore pray your Lordship will be pleased to grant them two hundred acres of land for each person.<sup>7150, p 2</sup>

• The last sibling of William Roberts Eckart was born and both of his parents died within one month in early 1812. From the record it would appear that they left, as orphans, 7 children ranging from 14 year old Margaretha to the newly born infant Henry. While later records indicate that many of these children remained in Quebec City for some time, it does not show who looked after their care and nurture. After 1812 there seem to have been no Eckart entries in Church Registers in Quebec City until 1828 – a strong indication that the two Jonathan Eckarts who died in 1794 and 1812 were the only Eckarts who emigrated to Quebec.<sup>22, p 2, note 13</sup>

Also see<sup>22</sup>, page 1, note 1 for reference to first Jonathan Eckart, who died 2 June 1794, aged 60 years and 27 days. He was probably a great uncle of William Roberts Eckart and probably the first of the Eckart family in North America.

• I do not believe that my findings completely rule out the possibility that one or both Jonathan Eckarts was a Londoner at one time or another. They appear to have been of the merchant class with much better than average education and many such families had branches in both England and Germany. After all, the King and the Kaiser were first cousins!<sup>22, Letter</sup>

• He [Jonathan Eckart, d 1794] had another nephew of the name of Eckart who lived in Quebec and who inherited a part of his fortune. Maybe this one is your ancestor.<sup>5280</sup>

• Be it remembered that on the Sixteenth day of June [1794] in the Thirty fourth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain....Jonathan Eckart, John Rheinhart, Christian Rapp, and John Frederick Rheinhard, all of the City of Quebec...for the purpose of choosing a Curator to the vacant Succession of the late Jonathan Eckart, and having been severally duly sworn, after due deliberation, thy chose

# John CARLISLE - G Grandfather

• John Carlisle came to Chillicothe, Ross County, Ohio, with his parents, Andrew Carlisle and Eleanor Carlisle, in 1792, when it was part of the Northwest Territory.

In 1801, on April 30th, at Chillicothe, Ohio, John Carlisle and Elizabeth Mann were united in marriage by the Rev. M. Speer, of the First Presbyterian Church.

He always wore a cue and persisted in this peculiar style of dressing his hair until his death, which occurred July 19th, 1847, at the family homestead on Main street, Chillicothe. Every morning during his life he had his hair dressed and his cue braided and tied with a black ribbon by his barber, Jim Richards. His hair was black and made a braid about two feet long.

The following obituary notice was taken from the Scioto Gazette of July 21st, 1847, Chillicothe, Ross County, Ohio:

"Died – In this city about one o'clock A. M. on Monday last, after a short and painful illness, in the seventy-sixth year of his age, John Carlisle, Sr., Esq.

"The deceased for the last fifty years has been one of the most active and useful citizens of Chillicothe.

"He settled here about 1792, and soon entered upon a successful and extensive mercantile career, which was continued until after the late war with Great Britain.

"During the struggle in which the people of the Scioto Valley warmly participated, Mr.

Carlisle on more than one occasion made large advances to the government, both of goods and provisions, organizing, transporting and equipping troops, from his own private purse, thus contributing material aid to his country.

"In his mercantile transactions he was distinguished for liberality to debtors, and promptitude to creditors, and ever combining the character of a public-spirited citizen, high-minded gentleman and an enterprising merchant.

"For the last twenty-five years Mr. Carlisle has devoted much of his attention to the interests of this town and county.

"In the address published in our last paper by the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for this county, ample testimony is borne to this philanthropic and liberal course.

"His services as Commissioner of Ross County continued to the day of his death and have been of marked utility. In the discharge of the different duties of that office, he probably gave just offense to none.

"Mr. Carlisle was ever an ardent and honest politician, none more uncompromising of principle, none more lenient to the convictions of others than he. A close and intimate personal friend of Henry Clay and of General William H. Harrison, and others of national reputation, but a closer and more intimate friend of suffering humanity, and particularly so of the poor and unfortunate of our own community.

"We trust that some contemporary of Mr. Carlisle's will furnish our city with a suitable notice of the life and career of this aged and respected citizen. He was one of the few men of the olden time who have been spared to the present generation, as examples of integrity and manly virtue.

"Mr. Carlisle as the father of a large family, all of whom, yet living, occupy respectable positions in society. He leaves an aged wife, with whom he has lived a faithful and a loving husband for nearly half a century.

"His funeral was attended yesterday by the Masonic fraternity, of which organization he was an honored member of high standing, and a large concourse of citizens, including the municipal authorities."

In the August number of the Scioto Gazette (1847) appeared the following clipping:

"Judge Bailhicke was formerly the editor of the Scioto Gazette, and at this writing is the proprietor and editor of the Alton (Illinois) Telegraph, and thus discourseth upon seeing the notice of the death of the late Mr. Carlisle:

" 'Passing away. The following obituary notice extracted from the last Scioto Gazette, of Chillicothe, Ross County, Ohio, a newspaper, the name of which recalls to us the many passing incidents of the olden time, announces the death of an old and valued friend.

" 'We became personally acquainted with the late Mr. Carlisle in 1812 and know that his great work as a man and public spirit as a citizen are not here overrated.

" 'To him more, perhaps, than any other individual is the beautiful city of Chillicothe indebted for many of its improvements, and notwithstanding his advanced age, his death may justly be considered a great loss to the community among whom he so long resided.

" 'The friends of our youth are passing away, one after another, and their departure from the stage of human action earnestly admonishes us that our own cannot be far distant.' "9, pp 6 & 7

• Their son John became a prominent business man in Chillicothe having a mercantile business at the SE corner of Paint and Main streets. His brother [sic] Henry Nelson continued in business with him and the two built a two-story brick building on this busy corner.<sup>648, p 118</sup>

• He [William Roberts Eckart] married Eleanor Carlisle, who was born in Chillicothe, Ohio, where her father, John Carlisle, was a pioneer resident, settling there in 1798. Mr. Carlisle was a merchant of prominence, a man of influence in public matters, and a Republican in politics.<sup>209</sup>

• The town of Chillicothe, in Scioto township, was made the seat of government for the Northwestern Territory in 1800, which was previously at Cincinnati, but by act of Congress removed to Chillicothe. It was incorporated as a town January 4, 1802, and the following officers appointed by General St. Clair, commanding the Northwestern Territory: ....John Carlisle, Members of Select Council.<sup>642, p 128</sup>

• The first flat boats that floated down the Scioto were two sent out by McLaughlin and John Carlisle, in 1803, from Chillicothe, and destined for New Orleans.<sup>63, p 79</sup>

• For some time the Chillicothe congregation worshipped in the old state house, the use of which was generously offered to them. There is no record as to the time when the first meeting house was erected; but it must have been commenced not long after Mr. William's acceptance. In the then existing circumstances of the congregation, the building of a church was a work demanding great courage and self-denial. After commencing the building, they found themselves unable to finish it, and were in danger of losing all they had invested. In this emergency John Carlisle came forward, and at his own expense finished the building and handed it over to the congregation free from debt.<sup>63, p 249</sup>

- A toll bridge was constructed across the Scioto in 1815, the company owning it

belonging to... John Carlisle.<sup>641, p 70</sup>

• The campaign of 1840 was the political event in the history of Chillicothe. As may be inferred from the preceding statement, the political sentiment was largely with the "Tippecanoe and Tyler too" party... This...prepared the way for the largest and most enthusiastic political meeting ever held in Ross County. ...it was estimated that forty thousand people assembled at Sugar Grove to hear General [William Henry] Harrison. On this occasion the ladies of the city presented General Harrison with a cane cut on the battlefield of Tippecanoe where he won distinguished honors as a military officer. John Carlisle delivered the presentation speech, to which the General responded feelingly and appropriately. The ladies concerned in this gift were ...Eliza Carlisle, etc.<sup>641, pp 75-6</sup>

• Coming to Chillicothe in 1802, he [John Waddle] became a clerk with John Carlisle, another Irishman, born in 1771, who had come to Chillicothe with his parents in 1798.<sup>641, p 148</sup>

• John Carlisle [was] among the first general merchants. In 1802 John Carlisle advertised that he kept superfine and coarse cloths, cassimeres, blankets, camels-hair shawls, India lute-string, books and stationery, queens-ware, cutlery, coffee, tea, sugar, liquors and mill saws, a sufficiently varied assortment.

It is impossible to give a full list of the various mercantile enterprises which have flourished in Chillicothe; and the following list contains only a part of the more prominent firms:

Of the deceased it may be said, that, from a child, she knew the holy scriptures. She connected herself with the Presbyterian Church, of this place, in [obscured]. She was steadfast in the faith. In hospitality she abounded. In her family, she discharged the duties of a mother and of a Christian with great fidelity. She loved to hold converse with the Savior alone. In the constancy of her attendance on the means of grace—in her interest for the welfare of Zion, and in her prayers for the life-giving presence of the Spirit, she has left us an example that we may follow in her steps.

In reflecting on the many trials of affliction experienced by this mother in [obscured], we are reminded of this saying of the Psalmist: "Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord delivereth him out of them all." Through much suffering, she attained to a high degree of Christian patience and resignation. The language of her heart, as well as the expression of her lips, was this: -- "The Lord will do all things well." Being herself a sufferer for many years, she reflected much on the sufferings of Christ, and ever remembered Him, in the gardens and on the [obscured], with peculiar interest and tenderness in her last illness, which was painful, and continued for some weeks, she was greatly sustained and comforted by the presence and promises of her Savior. Her faith was strong -- her mind was peaceful -- her hope was sure and steadfast. Her last words were these: "I am leaning on my blessed Savior, and am happy." "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord," and blessed is that hope concerning them, which mingles with and [obscured] all the sorrows of surviving friends. Her days are numbered. Her work is done. She has crossed the Jordan. She has received her crown, and is now rejoicing in the presence of Him who hath said, "I am the resurrection and the life." A FRIEND.<sup>645,2713, pp 1-2</sup>

# General: • Mattapan's History

This small neighborhood' s history is often included as a part of Dorchester's, since the two were annexed simultaneously [to Boston] in 1870. Like neighboring towns, Mattapan was seen as an attractive place for a country estate by early citizens of Boston. In the 19th century, new transportation turned Mattapan into a "streetcar suburb" and carried businesses and middle-class families to Mattapan. At this time, Mattapan, named for the Mattahunt Indian word for the land, really came into its own.

Located in the south of Boston, Mattapan is bordered by Dorchester, Hyde Park, and Roslindale. It is transected by Blue Hill Avenue, the neighborhood's main thoroughfare and business district. Mattapan has long been home to an interesting mix of people.

Originally a rural retreat for Yankee Bostonians, Mattapan later became home to Irish and Italian immigrants, and after World War I was the center of Jewish life in Boston. Today, Mattapan's population is largely African-American.<sup>2817</sup>

• As for your comment about Mary Sproat leaving her marriage, I agree, I don't see why that would be legally recorded anywhere. However, at her <u>1792 marriage to Isaac Roberts</u> she was called a spinster, which I thought was reserved for women who had never been married? I'm not very familiar with Anglican church formulae but certainly the RC church is very particular about such things, so she would have been specifically identified as a widow in the register if it were a Catholic ceremony. The Anglican population of Quebec City was pretty tiny at the time so it seems unlikely that the community was unaware of her situation; but on the other hand, it was poor old <u>de Montmollin</u> who performed the ceremony, and he apparently spoke little English and wasn't, perhaps, a very good priest, so the wording can probably be overlooked in any case.<sup>8336</sup>



• Andrew Carlisle and his wife, Eleanor, emigrated to America in

1789, settling in Pennsylvania, and afterwards passed down through the Cumberland Valley into the Shenandoah, settling for a time in Virginia. They soon decided to cast their lot with the pioneers who were pressing forward to the frontier of the Northwest Territory, settling permanently at Chillicothe, Ohio in 1792. There, in Ohio's first capital, in the beautiful Scioto Valley, they lived out their lives of purity, doing good unto mankind, participating in the advancement of civic and state, honored and respected, and perpetuating their own lives in their good deeds. In 1821 both husband and wife died and were buried in the Presbyterian graveyard on Main street, at Chillicothe, being laid away in their last resting place by the loving hands of their honored son, John Carlisle, Esq.

Andrew Carlisle, Senior, was Past Grand Master of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Super-Excellent Masons, of Lodge No. 679, of Bally Gawley, registry of Ireland. He was of excellent standing, as is evidenced by testimonials and certificates of membership, given under seal by the High Priest and other officers of said lodge, under date of May, 1779. These old Masonic papers and others of high regard testifying to the sterling qualities of Andrew Carlisle, from James Kerr, dissenting minister, of whose parish at Termont McGurk, County Tyrone, North of Ireland, Mr. Carlisle and his wife Eleanor were members, and from Andrew Cochran, curate and one of His Majesty's justices, are now in the possession of Colonel Charles Arthur Carlisle, of South Bend, Ind.

Item 1st – I give and bequeath unto my son John Carlisle the use or proceeds of my Farm unto his son William Mann Carlisle comes to the age of twenty one.

Item 2nd – I do give and bequeath unto my grand sons Andrew and William Mann Carlisle, sons of John Carlisle, my Farm in Union Township with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, by Andrew Carlisle paying unto his Brother John Carlisle one hundred and fifty Dollars and William Mann Carlisle paying his Brother Henry Nelson Carlisle one hundred & fifty Dollars – the money to be paid to John & Henry Nelson Carlisle when W. M. Carlisle comes to the age of twenty one.

Item 3rd – I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Andrew, son of John Carlisle, my Desk, Book Case, and Large Gin C\_\_?\_\_.

Item 4th – I do also give and bequeath unto my Grand son William Mann Carlisle my

young horse now on the Farm. Saddle, Bridle & all my Gears.

Item 5th – I do give and bequeath unto my Grandchildren Eleanor, Andrew, William Henry, and John Carlisle children of my Son William Carlisle eighty Dollars to be equally divided between them out of the first money received for the Rent of my house and lot in Chillicothe.

Item 6th – I do give and bequeath unto my Grandson Andrew Picken, son of my daughter Nancy Picken, twenty dollars to be paid from the Rent of my house and lot in Chillicothe.

Item 7th – I do give and bequeath unto my Granddaughter Eleanor Ann Carlisle my Bed & Bedding.

Item 8th – I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Isabella Daily all my house and cupboard furniture also Twenty Dollars in money to be made from the Rent of my house and lot in Chillicothe.

Item 9th – I do also give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughters Eleanor Ann, Elizabeth, and Lucy Mary Carlisle, Daughters of my son John Carlisle, my house and lot in Chillicothe after the bequest before mentioned is paid and then to be left at the discretion of my Executors to dispose off. And I do hearby nominate constitute and appoint my son John Carlisle – my friend William H. Douglas and my grand son Andrew Carlisle Executors to this my last will & Testament hearby revoking and annulling all former wills by me made.

The Church registers only begin in 1784 (Church of Ireland) and thus would not include the period of 1600-1736 in which you are specifically interested. The earliest extant register for Termonmaguirk is 1834 and also is too late to be of use in this case. In this case research would have to be based on records of secondary importance such as Registry of Deeds, Wills, Estate Records rather than Church Registers. A search of the Grantor's Index to the Registry of Deeds, 1785-1795, is our best hope of success.<sup>3537</sup>

• REPORT

We regret to report that no significant progress has been made in this case and we have failed to find any trace of the Carlisle family in Termonmaguirk in the 18th century or earlier.<sup>640, p 2</sup>

• The Register from which the preceding Baptisms are taken, commences in 1698,—but it unfortunately ends in 1737, and from that period until the year 1777 no book of Registry can be found. It must also be remarked, that on first settlement of the Family in Ireland, and for a long time afterwards, that Country was in a very disturbed state, and Records were not easily preserved, or perhaps carefully made, so that many circumstances of early date are entirely lost.<sup>6315, p 222</sup>

General: • Termonmaguirk, also known as Tarmon-Mcguirk, is a parish situated partly in the barony of Strabane, but chiefly in that of Omagh, County Tyrone, some 9 miles South-East from Omagh town. In 1841 it contained a population of 10,307 inhabitants. According to the Ordnance survey, the Parish comprises 4,675 1/2 acres. The townland of Carrickmore comprises 915-0-5 acres and is entirely situated within this parish.<sup>640, p 2</sup>

Administration on the intestate estate of David Gorham of Yarmouth, yeoman, was granted to Josiah Thacher of Kingston, Mass., 27 March 1781. On the same day, Joseph Griffith, Atherton Hall and William Matthews of Yarmouth were appointed to take the inventory which amounted to £139-1-2, with claims against the estate totaling £421-5-4, leaving the estate insolvent. On 18 September 1781, Thomas Hedge, James Hawes and Atherton Hall were appointed to divide the real estate by setting off to the widow, Rebeckah Gorham, her one-third part. Josiah Thacher, administrator, on 6 December 1781, reported a balance remaining of £7-14-5, after the widow's allowance of £30 for necessary support. After the real estate had been sold, 10 January 1782, the judge accepted Josiah Thacher's final report, 12 March 1782, which allowed creditors only five shillings on the pound.<sup>18, pp 411-2</sup>

• David Gorham, of Yarmouth, was a soldier in the year 1762, in this company commanded by James Churchill, and did duty in Halifax, until Col. Was in full charge of the Mechanical Engineering Laboratories, giving courses in experimental Steam and Hydraulic laboratories. Designed and supervised the construction of both laboratories, for Fluid Flow and hydraulic machinery for the CE department. Organized the Civil Engineering course in the Fluid Flow Laboratory and gave the course for the first year.

During the absence of Prof. Durand during World War, I gave his course in Hydraulic Power Plants and continued same after his retirement.

During spare time and summers continued to assist W. R. Eckart Sr. with his consulting engineering practice. Among other things worked up experimental methods to be used in

connection with test of 5400 H.P. gas engine of S.F. Gas & Electric Co. (P.G.&E.). – Hydraulic power plant of Snow Mt. Water and Power Co. Test 225 H.P. gas engine, Cypress Lawn Cemetery. Test of Deer Creek Power Plant (P.G.&E.) using pitot tube for measuring quantity of water. Based on these tests pre-pared a paper which was presented and published by the Institute of Mechanical Engineers of Great Britain.

This paper entitled The Application of the Pitot Tube to Testing Impulse Water Wheels<sup>4368</sup> was awarded the "Water Arbitration Prize for 1910" by the Inst. of Mech. Engrs. The award was for the best original paper treating with any branch of mechanics of the supply or distribution of water, etc. for the previous two year period.

August, 1915 to May, 1925: Consulting Engineer, Columbia Steel Company

Made monthly inspection and reports on the maintenance of the plant at Pittsburg, Calif. Prepared reports on depreciation of buildings and equipment, etc. for setting up reserves and tax purposes. Work performed for W. E. Creed, Pres. and the Board of Directors.<sup>8</sup>

My dear Mother-

We are alright. Our place is a wreck but things might be worse. Our chimney fell through the roof in places & the bric-a-brac is broke-a-brac now & we have two plates left.

The University is a ruin so they say. I hope everything is alright with you. We can not get telephone or telegraphic communication – or you would have heard from us.

It was a fright. Estelle stood it pretty well.

We are going out [to] the University & see the ruin. The Memorial Church is down, the top off the memorial arch. Some of the arcades are down. The big stack is down & the new library a ruin. I see where we take things as best we can. With love –

• Letter from W. R. Eckart, Jr., Mechanical Engineer, 1125 Ramona Street, Palo Alto, Cal.: Sunday Morning, Apr. 22, 1906

My dear Father:-

I am sending the medicine & a few eggs & loaves of bread by Fuji our Japanese boy, also the morning paper.

I don't think I will come up again until conditions are a little more settled here, as the town is filling up with bad trash as well as the good people and I don't like to leave Estelle alone under the circumstances as naturally Mrs. [Torp?] is rather excitable.

We had a scare last night as Fuji got up about 1.30 AM to fix his [unclear] & then a little later went to the bath room & then found the cellar light burning so he went into the kitchen & turned it off. I thought it was him, but called him & made sure & as he didn't answer, the folks got badly frightened.

Had no trouble coming out. You must take every precaution against sickness over there. I met Dr. Martin. He is on the Red Cross & told me to get you all out of town. He is sending his folks out & is going to turn his house into a hospital. Of course there is great danger of sickness at a time like this especially with the sewers all broken, & the rumor of danger may be to get the people to move out to the country faster. However take no chances with water etc.

Send Clara Tickner down here if you can find her. If she gets to the Valencia St. depot alright she will have no trouble. We could take care of Mrs. Tickner also.

• Prof. Eckart agreed with Prof. Durand. He felt opposed to fees unless put on equally throughout the University. Spoke of students who could barely pay present laboratory fees and said from his own experience with students who had wished to take laboratory work but refrained because of lack of means to pay present fees that any further tuition expense would certainly bar out good men from our courses.<sup>4366, pp 8-9</sup>

Prof. Eckart: It might be legitimate to call attention to the necessarily expensive text books, drawing instruments, supplies, etc., of expensive nature which engineering students were required to purchase.<sup>4366, p 18</sup>

• [excerpts] In answer to your request for a statement of my views on the subject of the proposed tuition fees in the engineering courses, I would say,

That I do not believe that a tuition fee should be charged in the engineering courses, unless a similar fee is imposed upon all students of the University irrespective of the course they are taking. My reasons for such a view are as follows:

First:- This university was founded with the aim "to qualify students for personal success and direct usefulness in life."

Second:- The engineering students are surely not any better able to pay tuition fees, than the students in the other courses.

Third:- The engineering students are already paying by means of laboratory fees, etc.

Fourth:- They are however under heavier personal expenses than the men in the other courses, owing to the higher cost of engineering text-books, drawing instruments, etc.

Fifth:- That unless the work offered at Stanford can be proved conclusively to be so far superior to that in other institutions not charging tuition, there is nothing that will prevent the number of engineering students from dwindling away at Stanford.<sup>4367, pp 1-2</sup>

• Dear Doctor Jordan:

Knowing the interest you take in any of the work we have done, which may in any way reflect credit upon us or the University, I enclose for your perusal a letter which I just received from the Institution of Mechanical Engineers in London.

I would state that the paper was not written for or presented to them to be entered in any prize competition, as in fact, I did not know that such a thing was going on.

Kindly return the letter when you are thru with it and oblige.

It is our further desire to establish as a memorial to my father, and to foster and encourage experimental research in mechanical engineering, to which work his whole life was devoted; and especially to interest, assist and inspire young men who have shown an ability to conduct such work, a research fund to be known as

THE WILLIAM ROBERTS ECKART RESEARCH FUND FOR MECHANICAL ENGINEERING.<sup>4371</sup>

• In reply to your request for information as to my research activities, I would state that I am still engaged upon the study of:

"Heat exchange thru metal walls between liquids, vapors and gases", with especial reference to the problems of the oil industry.

"Atmospheric Cooling of Water."

"Absorption, Distillation and Fractionation Problems."

This work has, to a large extent, to be carried out in the field.

No financial aid is necessary.

My dear Lester:

Your letter of May 13th was very much appreciated. It is a long time since I have written

at any length. At Xmas I mailed cards to you & Mary and also the boys & their wives. At the start I tried to write notes on each of the cards but had to give it up, as I will explain later.

About the Palo Alto store and the decline in the business of the Woolworth 1956 sales. However, I appreciated what had caused it. do not know just when in 1956 the new business section & Woolworth store there opened for business. However, I was very thankful that Estelle had the benefit of all the very prosperous years as all that income was set aside for her own use to do as she pleased with it.

What you have written about all the things Palo Alto itself is doing in trying to bring some of the [business back] is very encouraging and was all news to me. They sure are on their toes. The parking problem is a big one everywhere, especially in Pasadena.

I was much interested in what they did about the Emerson St. property. If I recollect the bank on the corner of University Ave. & Emerson were always trying to buy it from Vic but he would have none of it.

I believe the project to put the new street lights on University Ave. to be a good one, and presume whenever it is done we will be assessed for our share. It will not worry me.

Now about the state of my health. I do not know when you last got a report on that. I know that Harriet & Nelson have stopped in Seattle to see you on some of their vacation trips north. Well it has had its ups & downs. Last year during July I discovered that I had glaucoma in both eyes and not cataracts as they told me when I was in the hospital & confirmed by [my] own oculist when I went to see him about it. My left eye had very little sight left, while the right eye had a pressure of 32, when a normal eye has 23 or more generally 25. So my new oculist started treatments with eye drops in both 4 times daily. Very shortly after this I was taken suddenly with chills & fever when I got up to go to bed. I managed to phone a neighbor to come over & undress me & get me to bed, while his wife phoned my doctor (Harriet was out for the evening somewhere). Well, it seems I had a virus infection & was in bed for quite & altogether had a trained nurse for two months. When I let the nurse go, the following day my left eye began to pain so I had to make an emergency visit to my oculist. He said I would have to go into the hospital for an operation. No room was available so he came to my house that night to operate. Fortunately I could get my trained nurse back. Well to operate he had to kill the nerve between the eye & brain which made me totally blind in that eye. My right eye is now 27 1/2 as to its pressure. However it is very hard for me to read or to write. As I look at this page I only see 3/4 of the last line & 1/2 of the line above. I get most of my news from TV. I live on baby & junior foods, 6 feedings a day, but am all free from that regurgitation I used to have. I get up at 5.45 AM & in bed at 11.30 PM. Sleep well, but the routine day is a

hectic one. The doctor says I am [a] wonder. My blood pressure is OK, pulse fine, lungs fine. I still have a chronic infection which he can't locate in spite of all X-rays etc. However I am content and in good spirits. Now away from me and something more pleasant.

Harriet & Nelson and their family are fine. The day before Easter David got word from Stanford that he has been fortunate enough to be able to enter there this coming fall. He has very high grades. All A's last year and 3 A's, a B+, & B so far this year. He passed the Stanford Intelligence test, and the Calif. Scholarship Federation and been honored with life membership a semester ahead of the usual time. He has played guard on the San Marino High School team 2 years. They won all games in their league last year & lost only one game this year. He is a good shot putter & yesterday qualified for the finals in all Southern Calif. Leagues. However he will not go into the finals as their are too many men who have superior records in some of the leagues with whom he did not compete.

Barney is a Junior at USC, and is evidently doing very well for him. He is pledged Beta. Harriet was here yesterday and sends her love. Donald they held back this year as he had not learned to read with the system they teach here. However, they just found out that one reason he is very nearsighted & could not see the blackboard even from the front row. Now he has proper glasses & is doing very well.

Well, Lester, I hope I haven't bored you with what I went thru last year. I will be 84 on May 25th. We have one lady living in an apt here who will be 103 in June. Dr. Durand is 98 & Fred (Estelle's brother) 93 on May 24th. (Estelle died on his birthday 2 years ago.)

• Of all the overestimated countries it is Japan, I think. I was there in the best season; saw the cherry festival, azaleas, wisteria, and iris - and these are cultivated. How any Californian can rave about Japan's flowers is a mystery to me.

The cities are dirty. The artistic places are the villages from a distance in a field of cultivated rice or grain, for the roofs are grass and occasionally a straggly pine adds to the landscape. To see men and women working in these fields is interesting of course. And mind. you, I found lots to interest me. But one trip to Japan will satisfy me.

You, too, would feel as I do. You would be filled with indignation at what one hears about these brownies waiting to get to war with the USA - that like myself, you would feel you were in enemies' ground.

One educated Japanese said to a fellow passenger on the way to Manila, "Oh, of course, we want the Philippines and Hawaiian Islands but we will wait until we can hold Calif. and the Pacific Coast." Another said, "We have the men and Navy but we lack the money so we must sack the banks of S F first." Imagine! These things are enough to show which way the wind is blowing. In Manila, they feel sure the Japs are planning mischief.

How I did enjoy our visit to Manila! It would make you proud of your flag to see the conditions there compared with other colonies we had visited. We awoke those little brown men about 50 years ago. And I guess it is up to us to put them to sleep again. But when you know their Navy and Army outnumbers us by 7 times, you can see what the danger is. They can take the Pacific Coast when they please. Our resources would win in the end. But think of the sacrifice. Our best men would answer the call to arms and our dear old Calif. be in the hands of those swell-headed monkeys for a good many months if not years.

One sees with regret how few ships we have. One realizes how handicapped we are. Our shipping amounts to nothing on the Pacific today. This is the only line flying the stars and stripes. Others sail under the "Union Jack" for convenience. While the Japanese have any amount of ships they would turn into transports. Oh, I just get so worked up over this I have to write my thoughts even though you may not be in sympathy. But the trouble is, we at home don't realize the danger. The Anglo-Japanese Alliance expires in 1913, so if trouble comes, it will be before then, I suppose. Though I suppose Germany would help us, except you remember Dewey thought for awhile we would have to whip Germany too when we were annoyed by their interference at the time he took the Philippines. Japan and Germany must spread out. They must have room to colonize. One can see how crowded they are. Every foot of ground is cultivated. But we don't want the Japs to spill over our way, do we? Australia is just as anxious about the Japs. They fear Japan has an eye on their territory. I have heard a great deal of this coming from Manila. My companion had been a guest of the Commander General for five months, and she told me a few things that opened my eyes. So it wouldn't surprise me if we were plunged into the deepest trouble by these deceitful brownies. I despise them for I feel every one on this boat is a spy.

If I had money to give to missions in Japan, I'd keep it for our Red Cross.<sup>1856</sup>

When her family is raised, when the demand on her time is less, she will have time to think and it may be that she will be interested in all these little events I am writing you.<sup>6, p 6, lines 227-233</sup>

• Finally, Amy Estelle was "Aunt Estelle" in this family. I recall her as a great hugger in the 1930's. My mother had a very unique relationship with her which is another story that will have to wait another day.<sup>3274</sup>

• The last time I saw Mr. Amy, Anne, Alice and I were in S.F. (I was not married); we met on the street. He asked where we were going and as we were going to lunch, and he to his breakfast we went as his guest to Marchand's – and such a meal – ordered all in French. One thing, I remember and cooked after I was married was French fried onions in olive oil.

Another year has gone, and my darling baby, Miriam – will celebrate another anniversary. I do hope you are well and that God will bring you his choicest blessings – what a joy you have always been to me.

I do love you so! I always see this "dear Mary" bathing you in the kitchen by the oven and I can hear her exclaiming "Did you ever see such a baby" to the doctor who said "If you don't stop kissing it and dress it, you'll kill it."<sup>6, p 6, lines 244-255</sup>

• Grandmother was always a woman of strong opinions and firm determination. She had an indomitable spirit. Her death was premature. While walking from her apartment on Orange Grove Boulevard in Pasadena, and crossing Colorado Boulevard (legally, in the crosswalk with a green signal), she was struck by a Navajo Indian firefighter making a left turn. This driver had no license and no insurance. The force of the impact sent her flying for upwards of fifty feet, where she came to rest against the curb.

She lingered in the Huntington Hospital and a rest home for a month. I visited her with Mom and Dad, and it was a very sad sight. She had a will to survive but the injuries were too much for her.

Estelle Walter were married midst veritable bower of floral beauty. Miss Waiter was attended by Miss Eleanor Eckart as bridesmaid and Miss Josephine Rider of Napa as maid of honor. The bride wore a wedding gown of crepe de chine over white satin, made en train. Her only ornament was a pearl and diamond brooch, a gift of the groom.

The groom was attended by his brother, Henry [sic] Eckart, as best man. The honeymoon will be spent at Congress Springs, after which Mr. and Mrs. Eckart will take up their residence in San Francisco

The wedding was the ending of a pretty romance which began a year a year ago in Yosemite Valley, when the couple first met.<sup>8038</sup>

My father and his two brothers are all deceased.<sup>170</sup>

• Charles Eckart of the HSPA Experiment Station invented an asphalt impregnated paper for mulching plants in 1914, and used it to suppress weeds on the sugar plantations.<sup>7362, p</sup>  $_4$ 

• Among the local people are C. F. Eckart, director of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters' Experiment Station. Mr. Eckardt [sic] went to the Coast on a health trip. Mrs. Eckhardt [sic] is not well and she remained behind.<sup>7362, p 1</sup>

• Mr. Eckart is manager of the great Olaa sugar plantation.

Mr. Eckart is the son of Mrs. W. R. Eckart of Palo Alto and the late W. R. Eckart, the famous engineer.<sup>4016</sup>

• Charles F. Eckart was truly one of the pioneers of the modern Hawaiian sugar industry, for to his credit goes not only the creation of that wonder cane, H-109, but also that of being the first man to cross pollinate sugar cane successfully, an agricultural practice on which the cane sugar industry in now so vitally dependent.<sup>233</sup>

• I noticed that my grandfather C. F. Eckart's education (degree & date) didn't seem to fit his bio very well. It's listed as MS 1905, U. of California. That's about 10 years after he arrived in Hawaii and with no BS preceding it. According to my uncle Thomas G. Eckart, his father's MS degree in 1905 from U. C. Berkeley was an Honorary Degree. He did a couple of years at Cal then left for Hawaii and got a job as a chemist. He was also offered a Doctorate by the same institution but declined because he didn't want to spend the time doing a thesis.<sup>234, p 1</sup>

• In the first place let me say that you and Bob are really two very lucky young men to have found employment at this time. Just how lucky you are I doubt if you can realize. Anything in the way of employment these days is something precious which should be nursed and fostered. The situation up here is so appalling and critical, financially, that from one day to another one doesn't know what to expect. I am not an alarmist but I often wonder what the outcome will be.

As an example my cousin, Charlie Carlisle, who a short time ago was worth millions of dollars and had no cloud on the financial horizon, is now reduced to an extent which is pitiable. He and his family are having a hard time making both ends meet. My own income has been cut to the point that we've had to give up our servants and economize in every way possible. I even spend most of my time at home in order to save street car fare. The worry about property and other taxes which must be met is a constant bogey.<sup>1484</sup>

• Here is a brief run down on some Eckart history in Hawaii. It would be interesting some day to prepare a summarization in a little greater detail. Your grandfather, after completing his junior year at U. C., departed for Hawaii in a sailing vessel; year, I think, was 1895. He took a position at Hakalau Sugar Co. on the Island of Hawaii as a chemist. In 1909 he was made the first director of the Hawaiian Sugar Planters Experimental Station in Honolulu. His work in soils, plant foods and sugar cane breeding was brilliant in the world of sugar cane culture. Actually he was the first man to successfully breed sugar cane and one of his seedlings – H109 (will all development records in his unique handwriting) – became famous throughout the Territory and actually saved the Hawaiian Sugar Industry in replacing a variety called "Lahaina" which was being wiped out by root rot disease. H109 was not only tolerant to the disease (resistant would be a better word) but was high in

sucrose and had all the desirable characteristics in fiber, growth qualities, etc. His outstanding work was recognized by the University of Calif. and he was presented with a Masters Degree in Soils and Plant Science. The University rules were temporarily suspended in order to do this – as he had not graduated and did not hold a Bachelors Degree.

In 1913 your grandfather was made manager of Olaa Sugar Co. on the Island of Hawaii – just 10 miles from Hilo on the way to the volcano. He held this position until 1920 at which time he became consulting Director of American Factors. It was at Olaa that he invented the Paper Mulch to improve the growth of sugar cane (and all plants) and to control weeds. And at Olaa he built a paper mill to manufacture this paper mulch which was used in the fields. The paper was made of [unclear] – the waste pulp of the cane following sugar extraction. He experimented in our back yard at Olaa and found that tobacco, tomatoes, asparagus, pineapples etc. etc. etc. all made fantastic growth when grown with paper mulch. Jim Dole – a family friend – often visited us at Olaa. He recognized the value of paper mulch to the production of pineapples – observed in our back yard – and offered Dad \$50,000 for Territorial Rights for pineapples (patent). Dad was primarily interested in sugar cane and sold the rights to Dole. Dole eventually made many millions from paper mulch royalties, when all the big packers – Cal Pack – Libby and others went into pineapple production in Hawaii. Paper mulch is still a must in pineapple culture in Hawaii.

In 1925, we all moved to Oakland where your grandfather devoted his full time to the promotion of paper mulch throughout the U. S. About 1927 he sold certain rights to the International Paper Co. for \$100,000 – and things were going great. Then came the depression and the paper mulch business came to a stand still. In March of 1934 he passed away following "Bright's disease." He was a most remarkable – and wonderful man.<sup>2434</sup>

• [excerpts] Thank you for your interest in our company and for taking the time to contact C&H Sugar Co. I forwarded your message to Keith Olsen, who is the historian at the Crockett Museum. He conducted some research and I will send along an article that he found. He also mentioned that you should be able to find out much more information if you travel to Hawaii. This article describes Eckart's activity in starting a pineapple development on Lanai:

"The next step was the development of paper mulch, which was accomplished by Charles F. Eckart,\* director of HSPA 1901-1914, and subsequently manager of Olaa plantation. He hit upon the idea of covering the freshly prepared soil with thirty-inch strips of

waterproofed mulch paper made of bagasse and spacing these so as to coincide with the center line of pairs of rows of plants about 20 inches apart, leaving a narrow strip of uncovered soil between. An airplane view gave the fields the appearance of a convict's back. Pineapples (or cane) were then planted by punching holes through the paper, two rows to the strip, and sticking the plants through these holes into the soil. The advantage of Eckart's "on-the-row" mulch over the "tween space" planting is evident but, as frequently happens, when an improvement is wrought, accessory advantages, not anticipated, are achieved. Thus the improvement over the old practice of planting between the strips of paper, consists in the accessibility of the uncovered strip to mechanical cultivation, while at the same time providing a shield against the weeds. The paper enables the roots to use the top soil without competition from weeds. Furthermore, it keeps the soil warm and moist and makes the deficient rain water of Lanai do double duty. It prevents leaching of fertilizers and finally creates a condition favorable to nitrification. Where five pineapples grew before, six grow now and they thrive even in dry years. Hawaiian Pine's former fields of 80,000,000 annual plantings can now produce the equivalent of 96,000,000 plants. The patent for this mulching system was acquired by Hawaiian Pine and the royalty contributions to date have amounted to nearly \$2,000,000.4355

# • H-109 CANE'S INVENTOR DIES ON THE COAST [excerpts]

C. F. Eckart Also Developed Paper Mulch; Sons On Way To Funeral

The death Wednesday in Berkeley, Cal., of Charles F. Eckart, former island resident, ended the life of one of the outstanding figures in Hawaii's agricultural life.

To him is credited the development of H-109 sugar cane, known as "Hawaii's wonder cane," and the invention of paper mulch for use in pineapple cultivation.

He was born in Marysville, Cal., June 18, 1875, attended the University of California and there began his life work as an agricultural chemist and technologist.

Mr. Eckart was the first agriculturist in Hawaii to grow sugar cane from true seed, accomplishing this when he was director of the H. S. P. A. experiment station. The cane H-109 was one of many seedlings developed by him. This cane was tried out at Ewa plantation by the late George F. Renton and has virtually supplanted the former standard variety, known as Lahaina.

His paper mulch process has gained world wide recognition. The paper is used here by the pineapple industry in the pineapple fields, the paper being anchored to the soil and planting stock inserted through holes. With the ground covered by the paper mulch, weed growth is checked and moisture preserved in the soil.

Mr. Eckart is survived by the widow and three sons, Charles G. Eckart, who resides in

California; Robert Eckart of Hilo and Thomas Eckart of Kauai. The latter two sons left for the mainland today on the Lurline to attend their father's funeral. Their wives are with them.

Mr. and Mrs. Eckart, after Mr. Eckart's retirement in 1921, resided in Honolulu until 1926 when they went to the mainland to live. They were visitors here in September, 1931, with their niece, Miss Eleanor Eckart.<sup>283</sup>

The Eckart's have resided on Kauai since 1935. Mr. Eckart received his degree in agriculture from the University of California.<sup>4020</sup>

• My father enlisted in the army in 1943. He was 35 years old, the "old man". He did return, for which I have been eternally grateful. He was stationed in the South Pacific, participated in the Battle of Leyte Gulf and wound up growing vegetables for the Navy on Saipan...his degree from UC Berkeley, Agriculture. When he returned home he worked as a County Agent for the University of Hawaii Extension Service, quit to open up a farm and garden supply store and wound up raising grapes in Sonoma County, CA. He received no benefits from the U.S. military....his records had burned with many others in a terrible fire. The Veterans of Foreign Wars presented his widow with a flag when he died in 1989.<sup>6525</sup>

• The Eckart Ranch on Kauai was a joint venture with Bob and Tom Eckart buying the property and my father developing it and eventually buying it from Tom. There were 60+ acres in the original parcel and my Dad sold off most of it, whittling it down to 12 acres which he sold in 1956. • They have picked the right man to run the Kauai county fair this year. He is T. G. Eckart. Back in Washington he would be called a real dirt farmer; a long, rangy fellow in khaki and high boots, he looks like a man who grows things with his own hands and not merely a theoretical agriculturist, but if you talk to him - he doesn't talk much - you would realize that his practical experience is backed up with scientific certainty; he belongs to that breed of men that has kept our Hawaiian sugar industry clicking so successfully over its long life.

T. G. Eckart brings to the job of director of the 12th annual Kauai county fair his own valuable experience as a successful agriculturist, and this experience is but the

continuation of the work of another man - his father, the late Charles F. Eckart.<sup>233</sup>

• At the age of 6 I started school at Olaa. My best friend was Minoru Matsumoto, the son of one of our yard men (now head carpenter at Olaa Sugar Co.) - I learned to swim at Warm Springs (destroyed several years ago by a lava flow) and at Kalapana (black sand beach). I started the 4th grade at Hilo Union School and made the trip each day from Olaa to Hilo and return by train. In 1919 your grandmother and grandfather made an extended trip and put us in Hitchcock Military Academy in San Rafael for a year. We all returned to the Islands in 1920 and bought a home at 2669 Nuuanu Ave. where we lived until 1925. During this period I went to Punahou and had many wonderful friends as classmates including Anna Karen Cooke and Alice Montague Cooke - daughters of Richard Cooke then president of Brewer & Co. – Harrison Cooke, son of Clarence Cooke – Paul Cooke, son of George Paul Cooke – Helen Gray Baldwin, daughter of Sam Baldwin (Alexander & Baldwin) - Walter Dillingham, son of Harold Dillingham - Wallace Waterhouse, son of John Waterhouse. Anna Karen Cooke married Ralph Johnson, an old friend from Hilo days, who became president of Hawaiian Electric (Ralph died about 4 years ago). I don't know what has happened to most of these people which really is a shame as we were all so very close – any of them would be delighted to meet you and know you – of this I am sure.

Anyway – to go on – in 1924 Bob and I were sent to the Menlo School for Boys. I graduated in 1927 and entered UC at Davis – spending two years at Davis and two years at Berkeley. At Davis I was very active – Vice pres. Of the Student Body, Student Council, sports editor of the yearbook, black letter society, Sword & Sandals (honor society), Alpha Zeta (national agricultural honor society), and worked from 4 AM – 8 AM each morning (asparagus). Was sent to Lihue [unclear] in 1933 as assistant agriculturist and Island Representative of the HSPA. In 1934 I took a position with Lihue Plantation Co. as agriculturist. Was made Head Overseer in Lihue in 1938. Left Lihue just prior to "Pearl Harbor" to take you and Marjorie to the U. S. to stay with May [unclear]. Decided against

going back to Kauai and resigned.<sup>2434</sup>



• This 1918 letter is written to an unknown person since he had no actual sister. "Sister" is likely a term of affection for his sister-in-law Harriet Louise Gorham Eckart, the presumed recipient of the letter [excerpts]:

My dear Sister

We were greatly pleased to get your letter, as we always are to hear from you.

As regards the genealogy of the Eckart family, I don't think there is any German about it excepting the name. Father was a native of Quebec, Lower Canada, and I never heard him mention anything about any German ancestry. On the contrary I was told that his youngest Sister, Annie Winslow Eckart, had gone to London, and had the genealogy of the family looked up in England. Father and his eldest sister, whom I knew, were both fluent French scholars, but could not speak German, their knowledge of French, was I presume occasioned by their living in Quebec which was largely settled by French. The above is all the information I can give regarding the family. Of one thing I am sure, if there is any German blood in me it is most thoroughly Americanized.<sup>152</sup>

• Cashier and Manager of the Northern California Bank of Savings, is a native of Ohio,

aged forty-five years, and has resided in this city a majority of the time since 1872, and has been engaged in bookkeeping and banking business all of the time. He is one of the best informed men in matters pertaining to banking business that can be found in the State, and was the leading spirit in establishing the present bank of which he is Manager, and which has been so successful in business.

The Northern California Bank of Savings was incorporated December 7, 1889, and commenced business in January, 1890, having as was supposed at the time, but slight prospects of meeting with success in a city of this size where there already two well-established commercial banking institutions. During the first six months, to July 1, 1890, the deposits amounted to \$158,388.82, and at the end of the first year, January 1, 1891, the amount had grown to \$237,260.79, and the number of depositors was 553, which was far in advance of the expectations of its projectors. Then it became necessary to have additional assistance, and to meet the demands the President, J. U. Hofstetter, assumed a share of the business, and joined Mr. Eckart in the active work.<sup>3356</sup>

• GEORGE R. ECKART. A man of energetic activity and of strong force of character, G. R. Eckart, of Marysville, as cashier of the Northern California Bank of Savings, occupies an assured position among the leading business men of Yuba county. A native of Ohio, he was born June 11, 1845, in Cleveland, of English ancestry. His father, W. R. Eckart, moved from Quebec, where his birth occurred to Ohio when a young man, settling in Cleveland, where he was engaged in business as a miller and a commission merchant until his death. He married Eleanor Carlisle, who was born in Chillicothe, Ohio, where her father, John Carlisle, was a pioneer resident, settling there in 1798. Mr. Carlisle was a merchant of prominence, a man of influence in public matters, and a Republican in politics. Of the union of Mr. and Mrs. W. R. Eckart, three sons were born, of whom two survive [sic], namely: William R., of San Francisco, a prominent civil and mechanical engineer, and George R.

Brought up in Ohio, George R. Eckart received his rudimentary education in the public schools of Cleveland and Chillicothe, and while living in Putnam, a suburb of Zanesville, where his father had a mill, he was graduated from Zanesville high school. Coming to California in 1872, he located in Marysville, and the following year entered the bank of Rideout & Smith as bookkeeper and accountant...

In Marysville, Cal., Mr. Eckart married Miss Josephine Bilhartz, a native of this city. Mr. Eckart is very prominent in Masonic circles... He takes an active interest in politics, and invariably supports the principles of the Republican party. For four years Mr. Eckart was city treasurer, and for a number of terms served as a member of the city board of

education. In 1904 he was the Republican nominee for mayor of Marysville and was elected in March of that year. He is a member of the Chamber of Commerce, and of the California Bankers' Association.<sup>209, pp 297-8</sup>



Sorely and deeply has the sorrows of the years, which has just departed, fallen upon me like the tempest of war poured upon my unhappy country, by an angry heaven, and who can foretell the grief which may await me in the future. Yet, still let not despair enchain me, though sorrow may overshadow me for a moment.

Let us live down, and conquer this mighty National sorrow, a nation for whose foundation, and freedom, <u>Washington</u>, Jefferson, Adams, Hamilton and their compatriots spent seven years of their lives in bloody, and at times, all but desperate warfare, may well require of us at least seven years of war for its salvation. Better die freemen, than live the slaves of the vilest aristocracy, which ever cursed a nation. It is my chief desire, and prayer to Heaven, that our afflicted country may once more be blessed with peace, and that friendship and good will may prevail among all men. Expecting, hoping, desiring peace, only under the <u>laws</u>, the <u>authority</u>, and the <u>flag of the Union</u>. This is a contest in which the greatest may be proud to engage, then let us rally to the conflict, always hoping, and never despairing, ever ready to <u>speak</u>, <u>write</u>, and <u>fight</u> for the Union.

If we are faithful to our cause, the New Year will close upon a reunited Republic.<sup>7424</sup>

• I am writing a Civil War biography of Lt. Charles E. Hazlett (1838-1863) and Capt. John C. Hazlett (1831-1863), both from Zanesville, Ohio, and found an entry for Isaac Roberts Eckart on your "Descendants of Jonathan Eckart of Quebec City" website. Isaac was originally from Ohio and enlisted in Capt. Hazlett's Company H, 1st Ohio Volunteer Infantry, at the outbreak of the Civil War. Because he was the company's 1st Lieutenant, he is mentioned repeatedly in a chapter I am currently writing about the company's activities during their three month enlistment at the beginning of the war. From what I have uncovered, he served with the unit from April until August of 1861 and took part in a skirmish at Vienna, Virginia and the battle of 1st Bull Run. He was slightly wounded by a shell fragment during the first engagement.

My question is this: You have a photograph of Isaac on your webpage and I would like to know if you are willing to share a clear copy, either by U.S. mail or e-mail. I have had a

very difficult time finding any photographs of individuals who were in Capt. Hazlett's unit and Isaac's photograph would make an excellent addition to the book. I would appreciate your help.<sup>7218</sup>

• I really appreciate all the material you sent. I will make sure to give you credit if the book is published and send you a copy.

Thought I would included a little more information about what I have uncovered relating to your ancestor's Civil War record:

Isaac enlisted in Captain John C. Hazlett's "Zanesville Guards," Company H, 1st Ohio Volunteer Militia on April 17, 1861. He was selected by Captain Hazlett to serve as the unit's 1st Lieutenant. The unit left Zanesville on the night of April 19, 1861 and travelled to Pittsburgh via Columbus. For roughly the next month, they were trained at camps in Lancaster, Harrisburg and Philadelphia. In late May, they marched through Baltimore, MD and were sent to Washington D.C. After crossing into Virginia, they took part in a skirmish at Vienna, VA (June 17, 1861) and then participated at 1st Manassas (July 21, 1861). They were mustered out of service at Columbus in early August.

I have a newspaper notice of Isaac trying to form his own company in Zanesville in August or September of 1861, but do not know what unit he served with afterwards or when he left Zanesville.

Captain Hazlett, who was apparently a friend of Isaac's, was later wounded at Stones River, December 31, 1862 and died June 8, 1863. His brother, Lt. Charles E. Hazlett was killed on Little Round Top, Gettysburg PA, July 2, 1863 and is very well known.

## • ISAAC R. ECKART IS DEAD

## Veteran of the Civil War Expires of Heart Failure After Long Illness

Heart failure was the immediate cause of the death of Isaac R. Eckart, which occurred at 9:30 o'clock Friday evening at the home on Third East. Death came after a long illness, beginning last February, but it was quite unexpected at the last.

Mr. Eckart was born Dec. 17, 1837, in Chillicothe, O., and spent his boyhood there. He was one of the first to volunteer from his native state at the time of the civil war and served his country through that time in Bragg's division of the army. He rose to the rank of a commissioned officer before the end of the war. Following that time he held numerous offices in the state, and later at one time he was superintendent of the waterworks of

Oskaloosa, Ia.

Mr. Eckart was a member of a well known family, one of his brothers, George K. [sic] Eckart, being at present the mayor of Marysvale [sic], Cal. Another brother, William R. Eckart, is one of the designers of the battleship Oregon. These, with his wife and two daughters, survive him. His daughters are Mrs. George G. Armstrong of Salt Lake and Mrs. E. S. Kerrick. They have been in almost constant attendance at his bedside since the beginning of his illness.

The funeral will take place at 3 o'clock this afternoon at St. Paul's church, of which Mr. Eckart was a member.<sup>249</sup>

# • VETERAN IS DEAD

Isaac R. Eckert [sic], father of Mrs. George G. Armstrong, died last night at his home, 430 South Fourth East street. Death was due to a complication of diseases. For a number of years, Mr. Eckert has been an accountant and was one of the best known men in his profession.

The funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 3 o'clock at St. Paul's Episcopal church. The body will be shipped to Oskaloosa, Ia., for burial.

The deceased is survived by a widow and two daughters, Mrs. E. S. Kerrick and Mrs. George G. Armstrong.

Mr. Eckert was born in Ohio 68 years ago. He was among the first to enlist in the Union army from that State for the Civil war. Entering the army as a private he was mustered out as a commissioned officer. He saw service during some of the heaviest fighting in Tennessee and Mississippi.

For a number of years he was superintendent of the Oskaloosa, Ia., Waterworks company. Eight years ago he came to Salt Lake City and has since made his home here.<sup>250</sup>

In 1817 he purchased 3,000 acres in the area, probably near his wife's property, and in the same year he announced his intention of petitioning the House of Assembly for permission to build a toll-bridge over the Riviere Famine in the parish of Saint-François (at Beauceville).<sup>3846, p 1</sup>

• Hanna's partnership with Delagrave and other plans were abandoned early in 1818 when he went bankrupt. ...his bankruptcy brought to an end the family's association of more than 50 years with the silversmith-merchant trade of Quebec.

Hanna probably left Quebec soon after his bankruptcy. He settled on his wife's property in the Beauce where he attempted to live the life of a seigneur.<sup>3846, p 1</sup>

• M. James Godfrey Hanna was a "horloger" someone who repairs the clocks and watches, living in Quebec City. He even knows what street: Cote de la Fabrique, very close to Chateau Frontenac (if you have ever visited the old town, Quebec city is beautiful and some parts well preserved like the beginning of Nouvelle France). This corresponds exactly with your Record.

## • DEATH OF AN OLD CITIZEN

Mr. Andrew Carlisle, one of our oldest and most respected citizens and the oldest merchant in the city, died at this residence on Caldwell street, on Sunday morning last, after an illness of several weeks. Mr. Carlisle was born in this city June 15th, 1802, and

consequently was in the seventy-seventh year of his age. He commenced business here in 1822, on Water street, where the Lake House now stands, the name of the firm being Carlisle & Dimmitt. He moved from there to the stand now occupied by Moses Hurst, and thence, in 1833, to the corner of Main and Paint streets, where he was engaged in business at the time of his death. At that time that location was in the suburbs, and clear outside the range of business. He purchased it of the United States Bank. • Henry Nelson Carlisle died about six months before his partner and oldest brother, Andrew, in the fall of 1878, in his sixty-ninth year, having been born in this city November 24, 1809. On the 27th of October, 1841, he was married to Miss Elizabeth McLene, of Columbus, a daughter of General Jeremiah McLene, who was at one time secretary of State, and subsequently a member of congress from Columbus. His wife and two daughters survive him.

From an obituary notice, published at the time of his death, we extract the following:

"Mr. Carlisle was a member of the firm of A. & H. N. Carlisle, the oldest firm in the city, and has been connected with the business at the present stand, corner of Main and Paint streets, since 1826 — over fifty years. He was a successful business man, growing not only in wealth during all these years, but in reputation for honest upright dealings. He was a man whose word was as good as his bond. In private life he was an unassuming, genial gentleman, kind-hearted and charitable; giving not ostentatiously but liberally, but where his judgment taught him charity would not be mis-applied. No man had more friends among the older and substantial citizens of the county, and his death will be a cause of universal regret."

The officiating clergyman at his funeral was the Rev. Dr. Biggs, of the First Presbyterian church, of which Mr. Carlisle had been for many years a member.<sup>4034</sup>



• [He] engaged in the lumber business, owning a large sawmill and five thousand acres of excellent timber at the mouth of the Sunfish Creek, in Pike County, Ohio, on the Ohio Canal. After the great fire of 1852, Mr. Carlisle sold the majority of the lumber and aided materially in rebuilding Chillicothe. He sold out in 1854 and spent several years in traveling and prospecting.

During the War of the Rebellion, he was appointed from the ranks by Governor Dennison, of Ohio, to an honorable position with the Thirty-first Ohio Volunteer Infantry,

continuing until the close of the war.

After the war he was engaged in the wholesale grocery business at Chillicothe and Cincinnati, Ohio, with a branch store at Memphis, Tenn., supplying the five Government hospitals with food. He closed out the grocery business in 1867, and in 1876 engaged in the flouring and milling business at Worthington, Minn. In this adventure, through endorsing for others, financial reverses overtook him, and retiring from active business, he removed with his family to Cleveland, Ohio, and in 1894 removed to Evanston, Ill., in order to complete the education of his youngest son and to establish a home for two of his sons who had located in Chicago. In 1900 his sons, whose business associations made it necessary to locate in the East, concluded upon establishing themselves at Buffalo, and early in the spring of 1901 the family went to Buffalo, N.Y., to live.<sup>9, p 8</sup>

• [excerpts] When I sailed from my home in New London, Connecticut, for California in the Summer of 1849, little was known of that distant region. Our war with Mexico was at an end, and the treaty of peace in which California was ceded to the United States had been proclaimed by President Polk on the 4th of July 1848. Letters from some of our army officers in California were published in Eastern papers in the Fall of that year, given accounts of the discovery of gold and the general rush for the mines. These were confirmed by the President in his annual message, his statements being based on the official report of General Mason, then in command of that military department.

The "California Fever", as it was called, rose rapidly throughout the country and in nearly every seaport vessels large and small were bought by rapidly organized companies and fitted out for California. During the year three ships, four barks and eleven schooners were fitted out for such voyages at New London. Sometime in the Spring of 1849, a strong impulse was given to the excitement there by the arrival, directly from San Francisco, of the "Flora," a New London whaling bark of three hundred and thirty-eight tons burden. Having gone into that port her crew had deserted her and gone to the mines. After considerable delay a new crew was shipped and she returned home. Here were witnesses directly from the New Eldorado. A company soon bought her and rapidly made her ready for sea. She sailed July 3rd, 1849. I took passage on her, being attracted not only by the stories of successful gold hunting, but by accounts of the large salaries paid to clerks in San Francisco, ranging from \$1,800 to \$3,600 a year, for services which I was sure I could render. Being but seventeen years of age and of a slight build, I had some doubt of being equal to the work in the mines.

Five months and a half later, after passing through calms, — including one of ten days at the Equator, — and gales, — including a fierce one of twenty-six days off Cape Horn; after experiencing the heat of the tropics within two hundred and fifty miles of Africa and the cold of the Frigid Zone as far South as Latitude 60°; after making the acquaintance of whales, porpoises, flying-fish, albatross (always called "gonies" by the sailors), Cape Frio pigeons, and "Mother [blank] Chickens;" after a ten days visit at St. Catherines in Brazil, and five days in Talcuahana, Chile; and after we had sufficiently enjoyed each other's society and the long imprisonment on shipboard, we arrived at San Francisco on the 19th of December 1849.<sup>4060, pp 1-3</sup>

• In the latter part of February [1850], I left San Francisco on a small schooner bound for Yuba City. We crossed San Francisco, San Pablo and Suisun Bays and sailed up the Sacramento and Feather rivers, reaching our destination after a voyage of ten days. The

place would have furnished a good model for Dicken's "Eden." The proprietors of the town site had offered to give alternate lots to those who would build houses thereon. The consequence was that the locality was dotted with little, insignificant, uninhabited and uninhabitable structures of one story, ten or twelve feet square, without floors, constructed of "shakes" or rough timbers made by the sole use of axe and wedge. The donees then waited for the donors to improve the intermediate lots they reserved. They waited in vain. There was better management at Marysville, about two miles distant on the Yuba River, near its mouth, and there I took up my abode. No lots there were given away. A few active men had brought merchandise of various kinds, and quickly set up their cloth covered frame houses for stores about the small plaza. Their activity encouraged that great advance agent, the saloon, to erect itself; and a few gamblers, fiddlers and singers lent their talent to make the evenings lively. It was now March, and placer mining was beginning to reward the labors of the prospectors both on the Yuba and the Feather Rivers, and the little town grew rapidly<sup>4060, pp 14-15</sup>

• Marysville was a typical California town during the period of transition from a Mexican "department" to the organized state of California. The necessity of a local government was first felt in January, 1850 from the want of an officer to acknowledge deeds. The universal national American remedy of a town meeting was at once resorted to, and Stephen J. Field was elected Alcalde.<sup>4060, p 16</sup>

• Judge Field appointed me his clerk on the 20th of March 1850.<sup>4060, p 17</sup>

• I [Tom Rueter] was searching the web last night and came across this statement by Stephan J. Field in Reminiscences of Early California - Yuba County History.

One day whilst I was Alcalde, a bright-looking lad, with red cheeks and apparently about seventeen years of age came into the office and asked if I did not want a clerk. I said I did, and would willingly give \$200 a month for a good one; but that I had written to Sacramento and was expecting one from there. The young man suggested that perhaps the one from Sacramento would not come or might be delayed, and he would like to take the place in [p.39] the meanwhile. I replied, very well, if he was willing to act until the other arrived, he might do so. And thereupon he took hold and commenced work. Three days afterwards the man from Sacramento arrived; but in the meanwhile I had become so much pleased with the brightness and quickness of my young clerk that I would not part with

him. That young clerk was George C. Gorham, the present Secretary of the United States Senate. I remember him distinctly as he first appeared to me, with red and rosy cheeks. His guickness of comprehension was really wonderful. Give him half an idea of what was wanted, and he would complete it as it were by intuition. I remember on one occasion he wanted to know what was necessary for a marriage settlement. I asked him why. He replied that he had been employed by a French lady to prepare such a settlement, and was to receive twenty-five dollars for the instrument. I gave him some suggestions, but added that he had better let me see the document after he had written it. In a short time afterwards he brought it to me, and I was astonished to find it so nearly perfect. There was only one correction to make. And thus ready I always found him. With the most general directions he would execute everything committed to his charge, and usually with perfect correctness. He remained with me several months, and acted as clerk of my Alcalde court, and years afterwards, at different times was a clerk in my office. When I went upon the bench of the Supreme Court, I appointed him clerk of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of California, and, with the [p.40] exception of the period during which he acted as secretary of Gov. Low, he remained as such clerk until he was nominated for the office of governor of the State, when he resigned. Through the twentyseven years of our acquaintance, from 1850 to the present time, July, 1877, his friendship and esteem have been sincere and cordial, which no personal abuse of me could change and no political differences between us could alienate. His worldly possessions would have been more abundant had he pursued the profession of the law, which I urged him to do; and his success as a public man would have been greater, had he been more conciliatory to those who differed from him in opinion.[p.41] <sup>3925, pp 2-3</sup>

• George C. Gorham, another early-day lawyer of Marysville, became secretary of the United States Senate, through the efforts of his friend, Judge Stephen J. Field, a position he held many years. He was distinguished as a great orator.<sup>211, p 127</sup>

• He resided in 1896 at 1763 Q Street, Washington, D. C. He was for many years Clerk of the U. S. Court at San Francisco, Cal., Republican candidate for Governor in 1867, and afterwards Secretary of the Senate of the United States. He wrote a biography of Edwin M. Stanton, in two volumes.<sup>13, p 600</sup>

• 12 June 1867, George C. Gorham was nominated for governor of California by the Union Party. He was defeated by Henry H. Haight, the nominee of the Democratic Party.<sup>13, p 601</sup>

• Henry Huntley Haight, born at Rochester, NY, May 20, 1825; died at San Francisco,

Cal., Sept. 2, 1878; graduate of Yale, 1844. He removed from Rochester, NY to St. Louis in 1846 where he began the practice of law, but left St. Louis Nov. 1849, for California and arrived at San Francisco, July 20, 1850. He was eminently successful in the practice of law in San Francisco and acquired a considerable fortune. He was elected on the Democratic ticket Sept. 5, 1867, Governor of the State of California over George C. Gorham, the Republican candidate, by a majority of 10,000 votes, being the first Democratic Governor elected after the Civil War. He held the office of Governor until December, 1871.<sup>790, p 619</sup>

• Clerk of the Marysville City Council from 1856 to 1857.<sup>814</sup>

• George C. Gorham, 1859-60. Was admitted here but never practiced. Editor of the Marysville Daily Enquirer, 1855-56, and the Marysville National Democrat, 1859. On the San Francisco Nation, 1860, and the Sacramento Union, 1861. Clerk in United States District Court, 1865-67. Candidate for Governor, 1867. Secretary United States Senate, 1868-79. Secretary National Republican Executive Committee, 1876.<sup>3062</sup>

• In that campaign [for Governor] I was loaded down with issues on which a majority of our people had never been obtained. Our State had voted for the Union, but not for the equal rights of the colored people. I was invited to address the Anti-Chinese Societies in San Francisco, and declined in a letter disapproving their scheme of proscription and inhumanity. This created the most intense prejudice against me. The whole Congressional scheme of reconstruction had just been enacted, and this was its first presentation for endorsement on the Pacific coast. So earnest was the general desire for Republican success that the Governor of Oregon, and Senator Stewart, and Representative Fitch, of Nevada, came into the canvass, and spoke at all prominent points during the campaign. I was caricatured from one end of the State to the other, with a negro, a Chinaman, and an Indian on my shoulders. I made nearly forty speeches in the open air, traveling about two thousand miles to meet appointments, and everywhere proclaimed the most advanced views of the party, among other things, advocating the idea since embodied in the Fifteenth Amendment.<sup>4071, p 7</sup>

At center stands Gorham, whose shoulders support, one atop the other, a black man, a Chinese man, and an Indian warrior. The black man complains to Gorham, ". . . I spose we'se obliged to carry dese brudders, Kase des'se no stinkshun ob race or culler any more, for Kingdom cum."

Gorham replies, "Shut your mouth Cuffy--you're as indiscreet as Bidwell [another gubernatorial nominee] and Dwinelle--here's the way I express it--{grave}The war of opinion is not yet fought through. It must go on until national citizenship shall no longer be controlled by local authority, and "Manhood alone" shall be the test of the right to a voice in the Government.'" Chinese man: "Boss Gollam belly good man. He say chinaman vo-tee all same me1ican man--Ketch--ee mine all same--no pay taxee--belly good." Indian: "Chemue Walla! Ingen vote! plenty whisky all time--Gorom big ingin." At right a man in a top hat, holding a monkey on a leash, calls out mockingly, "Say, Gorham! put this Brother up."

• [excerpts] Into this volatile situation stepped former Secretary of the Senate George C. Gorham. Up to this point, the 51-year-old Republican had enjoyed an active career. Born in New York on July 5, 1832, and educated in Connecticut, he moved to California in 1849 -- joining other "49ers" in the mad rush to discover gold. Quickly tiring of that quest, he won a position as law clerk with Stephen J. Field, who became his lifelong mentor and friend. (Field went on to serve on the California Supreme Court and then the U.S. Supreme Court, where he would become the second-longest-serving justice in that body's history.)

In 1859, Gorham shifted to journalistic pursuits, first as assistant editor of the Sacramento Daily Standard and then editor of the San Francisco Daily Nation. During the mid-1860s, thanks to Justice Field, he served as clerk of the U.S. circuit court in San Francisco. In 1867 he ran as Republican candidate for governor of California. His efforts to gain better treatment of that state's exploited Chinese immigrant population proved unpopular with many voters and contributed to his defeat. Gorham then moved to Washington, D.C. to represent California on the Republican National Committee. On June 6, 1868, with an assist from California's influential Senator John Conness, he won election as Secretary of the Senate, succeeding John Forney, who had resigned at the conclusion of Andrew Johnson's impeachment trial.

Gorham's eleven years as Secretary spanned the post-Civil War Reconstruction era -- a time of great turbulence for the Senate and the nation.

When the Democrats gained control of the Senate in March 1879, they quickly replaced Gorham, who had been an active and outspoken Republican throughout his tenure. In 1880, the former Secretary became editor of the National Republican and quickly displayed his talents as a gifted editorial writer.

Gorham retired from the National Republican in 1884 and devoted the remaining quarter-century of his life to writing. His most notable accomplishment of that period was an authoritative two-volume biography of Edwin Stanton, Abraham Lincoln's Secretary of War.<sup>3518, pp 1-2</sup>

### TROUBLE AT BODIE

# Mine Officials and a Sheriff Flee for Their Lives

Virginia (Nev.) Chronicle, January 9

There was a report on the street last night that C. F. McKinney, Sheriff at Bodie, together with Superintendent B. R. Taylor of the Noonday mine and George Gorham, a lawyer from San Francisco, were driven from Bodie by the miners of the Noonday Mining Company last Saturday night, and had to flee for their lives, the miners threatening to hang them. The Chronicle reporter has not been able to get full particulars of the affair, but the street rumor is as follows:

About forty miners of the Noonday mine last month, for wages due, attached the property of the Noonday Company, consisting of about \$10,000 in bullion and \$2500 in quicksilver. James Showers (then Sheriff) attached the property, but advised the miners to let the company take the bullion to San Francisco, the Superintendent of the mine giving his work that when the bullion was converted into coin the men would be paid. On the 1st of January Showers was succeeded by McKinney as Sheriff, and the affair remained unsettled. The miners, seeing no chance of getting their wages, waited upon Superintendent Taylor, who put them off for a few days, and then having affairs growing very hot, left town with Gorham, the company's attorney. The miners were indignant, and threatened the life of Sheriff McKinney, who left immediately for Bridgeport. It is charged that both Showers and McKinney were in the scheme to defraud the miners of their pay, and that they played into the hands of the Superintendent and attorney. There is no truth in the report which has been freely circulated to day of the hanging of the Sheriff. Threats were made, however, not only to hang him, but to burn the works. The local paper is as silent as the grave, and it is evident that strong influences are at work to prevent publication.<sup>8, undated</sup>

# **DEATH FOLLOWS ACTIVE LIFE**

Came to Washington From California Over Forty Years Ago -

# Funeral Tomorrow Morning

The funeral of George C. Gorham, the veteran newspaper man, who died at his place of residence, 1763 Q Street, early yesterday morning, will be held from his late home at 11 o'clock tomorrow morning. Rev. Dr. Wallace Radcliffe of the New York avenue Presbyterian Church will conduct the services. The pallbearers will be: Mr. Justice Harlan and Mr. Justice Brewer of the Supreme Court, Senator Henry M. Teller of Colorado, former Senator William M. Stewart of Nevada, Joseph Cranford and James R. Watson. The burial will be private.

Mr. Gorham, who died after a short illness, was seventy-seven years old and for forty years had been well known in Washington. His career in journalism and politics was a notable one. From the time he came to Washington in 1868 until the day of his death he was closely associated with the leading men of the country.

## Entered Politics in California.

Although a native of New York, Mr. Gorham went to California at an early age and there laid his foundation for the great reputation he afterward made as a newspaper writer. When about eighteen years old he left Greenport, N. Y., where he was born in 1832, for New London, Conn. There he embarked for California, making the trip around the Horn. The gold fever did not hit Mr. Gorham when he reached California. He engaged in mercantile pursuits first, and later became clerk to Stephen J. Field, the alcalde [mayor] of Marysville, who was later an associate justice of the United States Supreme Court. Mr. Gorham took an active part in California politics, and was once candidate for governor of that state, being defeated by a few votes on account of his efforts to gain better treatment for the Chinese.

In 1868 Mr. Gorham came to Washington, and was made secretary of the Senate, which office he held until 1879. In 1880 he became editor of the National Republican of this city, and for four years his editorials in that publication attracted attention all over the country. He was pronounced one of the best editorial writers this country ever produced.

Some of his most effective leaders were written in support of the bill creating the interstate commerce commission, and especially the long and short haul clause.

Until the presidential campaign of 1896 Mr. Gorham was an ardent republican, but in that year he espoused the cause of William Jennings Bryan. He stuck to Bryan ever after, working hard for the Nebraskan at every opportunity. In 1900 he wrote the democratic campaign book.

### **Biographer of Stanton.**

In later years Mr. Gorham continued to write a great deal. In 1899 he completed and published a biography of Edwin M. Stanton, Lincoln's Secretary of War. This work is a textbook in many schools. While secretary of the Senate Mr. Gorham married Miss Effie Bassett, daughter of David Bassett of this city. One daughter, Maud Bassett Gorham, was born to them.

### Senator Stewart's Tribute.

Ex-Senator William M. Stewart of Nevada, a warm personal friend of Mr. Gorham, paid him the following tribute:

"Gorham was one of the most remarkable men I ever met. I was intimately acquainted with him from the spring of 1859. He was then a law clerk in the office of Stephen J. Field, later justice of the Supreme Court of the United States. He remained a friend of Judge Field until his death. The judge regarded him as a friend and able advisor.

"He was intuitively a great editor, and was known by his writings throughout the Pacific coast before he was twenty years old.

"He was engaged actively in the politics of California. Coming to Washington, where his reputation had preceded him, he was elected secretary of the Senate to succeed J. W. Forney. He remained secretary of the Senate until the politics of that body changed. He then did editorial work for many leading papers.

### **Of Strong Convictions.**

"Mr. Gorham was a man of strong convictions, which he would not surrender for any consideration, and because of this and other qualifications became an intimate friend of President Grant. Senator Conkling made him his intimate friend and associate.

"I do not know that his literary work [or] newspapers has been preserved or could now be collected. He wrote the life and times of Edwin M. Stanton, Secretary of War under President Lincoln, which will be referred to as authoritative by those who write the history of that great struggle in many years to come.

"Gorham never abandoned a friend in either good or bad repute. He would defend a friend or advocate a principle which he believed to be right without regard for personal consideration.

"All who knew him well will respect and honor his memory. I am glad I knew him, and enjoyed his original and instructive conversation for more than half a century. I hope the newspapers will speak of him as he deserves. Nothing more is necessary to gratify the feelings of those who knew him well."<sup>805</sup>

In the death of George C. Gorham, announced in the Union today, there passes away one of the men who formed a connecting link with the glorious past of California. Stirring as have been the political activities of the Republican party since its birth in this State, especially since Haight's administration, nothing has ever equaled the constant display of energy and ability that marked the career of George C. Gorham, to whom the Republican party of California, as we now know it, owed its existence, for it was through him that the Union party was organized, and out of that our present Republican party was developed.

Partisan feeling has died away. We no longer draw social and fraternal lines on party differences. We fail to realize the intense bitterness that characterized politics in the late '50s and the 60s and can scarcely comprehend the fierce struggle for supremacy of which men like George C. Gorham were the center.

Gorham had been a war editor of the Union, and, under his pen, the editorial columns of this paper never preached a treasonable doctrine or said a false thing. He had come to the Union from the Marysville Democrat which he had conducted as a straight-out Union paper, and it was in Sacramento that he gave all his restless energy to the formation of the Union party. His was a task compared to which those of Hercules were puerile. The Whigs were still strong and bitter; the Republicans were new and were distrusted; the Conness Democrats were still hoping for power, while, of the old Breckenridge Democracy, there were many who chose to stay by the Union. It was essential to amalgamate all these elements into an harmonious whole.

It is true that Gorham had as assistants in this effort some of the most vigorous men of the time, but he ad also to labor against the implied hostility, if not downright antagonism, of men who surrounded Milton Latham and his friends. Yet Gorham persevered, and, by working night and day, he accomplished what had seemed to be the impossible. He wrought harmony out of discord and the Union party stood as a monument to his indomitable efforts. With the end of the war, the Union was no longer able to support Mr. Gorham. He entered into alliances that we believed to be dangerous. His coalition with

the boss elements in San Francisco and the methods with which his nomination for Governor was obtained did not appeal to the Union. The columns of this paper were open to him, always, but he was unable to satisfy the body of the voters of his sincerity and his integrity. His position on the Chinese question was retrograde. He did not see the rising tide against Asiatic encroachments and his stand in favor of Chinese immigration – for it could be understood in no other way – forced into opposition even those who admired his courage in assuming such an attitude.

His defeat led to his withdrawal to the East and to Washington. We suppose that during the last administration of Grant, that of Hayes and even along so far as the early part of Arthur's, no single Californian wielded a larger influence in California's affairs at Washington. As Secretary of the United States Senate he was in a position to make that influence effective, and it is a strong testimonial to the worth of the man that no one can ever point to a single nomination secured by his efforts, or with his aid, that ever brought discredit upon the State.

He realized the error in regard to the immigration of Asiatics, and it is but just to him to say that Senator Newton Booth of California and Senator Jones of Nevada, to whose efforts the first anti-Chinese bill was due – the measure that was vetoed by Hayes – received his cordial aid.

Time has removed the animosities of the old days. We who were then his enemies have long since forgiven and forgotten and he, on his part, had forgiven, too. Today we remember only that he was one of the great men of that marvelous period in the political history of California when the leaders of the people were giants, and he was one of them. He occupies an enduring place in the annals of the Golden State, and history holds him dear as one of the heroic figures of the West."<sup>800</sup>

Coming to Chillicothe in 1802, he became a clerk with John Carlisle, another Irishman, born in 1771, who had come to Chillicothe with his parents in 1798. In a few years Waddle had a business of his own, was busy in pork-packing and flatboat commerce and during the war of 1812, he had important contracts for supply of the army. He lost nearly all his fortune in the troubles of 1819 and 1828, and died at Chillicothe in March, 1831.<sup>641, p 148</sup>

The manorial history from the beginnings of St-Georges demonstrated that the Eckart, Skene and Grant were owners in St-Georges, not in a purpose of colonization but in view of speculation only, because they had neither mill nor residence.<sup>7172, p 4</sup>

• Perhaps the Jonathan Eckart who arrived in New York in 1769.<sup>7183</sup>

• I read there were only 300 Protestants in Quebec in 1770 (prior to the arrival of German troops); it looks like they were all merchants or traders. It appears that several of the Reinharts in Quebec City worked for Eckart...I can't determine whether they had earlier military connections. I have notes that they were "youths (age 14) during the 1775 blockade" — perhaps in Quebec with their father.<sup>7172, p 5</sup>

• One word about another element—a law-abiding one—in our complex population, felt, but whose origin remains yet to be enquired into by our ethnologists: the German element. Whence and at what date came among us these notable men—the Wurtele,

Hoffman, Hesse, Ampleman, Ruthven, Von Koenig, Von Iftiand, De Rottenburg, Idler, Seybauld, Bowen, Stcepleben, Eeinhart, Colback, Hind, Wolff, Eckhart? How many of them can seek for their ancestors amongst the Brunswickers and Hessians, who landed at Quebec in 1776 under Baron Rediesel and with the various shiploads of Germans, chiefly from Wurtemburg, who emigrated to Canada to escape conscription during the early Napoleonic wars and previous. The Pozer family dates back to old George Pozer, the millionaire, as he was styled, but he did not come direct from Germany; he had first settled in New York and then returned to England, landing at Quebec in 1791.<sup>7172, p 6</sup>

• In 1789, we witnessed the seizure of the assets of Charles Doyon whose fief Saint-Charles-de-la-Belle-Alliance is awarded to John[sic] Eckart, merchant of Quebec.<sup>7173</sup>

• 2 June 1794 – Burial of Jonathan Eckart "Tobacconist, aged 60 years and 27 days." Note of A. E. Edwards: Undoubtedly related to William Roberts Eckart. Probably a great-uncle and probably the first of this Eckart family in North America.<sup>22, p 1, note 1</sup>

• Several members of the Wurtele family immigrated to the province of Quebec in the 1780s. Some chose to settle in Montreal but Josias, like his brother John, picked Quebec where his uncle Jonathan Eckart, who sold tobacco and sundries, was living. Eckart owned a house and retail business on Rue Buade which Josias inherited in 1795.<sup>3843, p 1</sup>

• I think that your information on Jonathan Eckart are not right. He had no child and it's the reason why it is Josias Wurtele who inherited a part of his fortune when he died in 1795. He had another nephew of the name of Eckart who lived in Quebec and who inherited a part of his fortune. Maybe this one is your ancestor. Josias's mother was Elisabeth Eckart.<sup>5280</sup>


