

Former Resident Dies in Tennessee

Joseph Ellis Oglesby, 84, formerly active in Salt Lake mining and railroad circles, died at the farm home of his son, M. L. Oglesby, near Clarksville, Tenn., Thursday at 1:30 p. m., said a special dispatch to The Tribune.

Mr. Oglesby was a resident of Salt Lake from 1883 to 1929, serving most of the time as general freight and passenger agent for the Rock Island railroad and as secretary-treasurer of the Emerald Mining company.

He was a native of Indianapolis, Ind. He came to Salt Lake from Kansas City, Mo. A graduate of Washington-Jefferson college in Virginia, he was one of the nation's oldest members of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity.

Mr. Oglesby was a member of St. Mark's Cathedral parish. Sixty-three years ago he married Miss Harriett Amelia Yundt of Lafayette, Ind. Surviving are the widow, two sons, three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. He had no relatives in Salt Lake.

Funeral services will be held at Clarksville Friday.
